METHODIST COLLEGE DEBATE TEAM

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Methodist College Debate Team experienced renewed success at an intercollegiate tournament hosted by James Madison University October 21 -24. Participants from twenty-one schools, including Dartmouth and Boston College from the north and University of Georgia from the south, competed in the three-day event.

The Methodist team of Travis Jordan and Todd Lyden completed the preliminary competition with a 5-3 win/loss record, earning an opportunity to compete in the octo-final break round. After advancing in octo-finals with a 2-1 decision over George Mason University, they were defeated by the eventual tournament champions, Mary Washington University, on a 2-1 decision in the quarter final debate.

The new director of debate, John Humphreys, said that this early success was important for two reasons: "This is a great success for our program. Neither of these gentlemen had even seen a debate two months ago and now they prove to be very competitive. Additionally, I think it's important to point out that because there are no divisions in debate, as there are in sporting activities. We were successful in head to head competition with much larger schools with well financed programs. For example, both George Mason and Mary Washington are ranked in the top five schools nationally."

The debates were focused on this year's national topic, "Resolved: that the commander-in-chief power of the United States President should be substantially curtailed."
