PIANIST, CELLIST TO GIVE CONCERT AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Cellist Nancy Green and pianist Frederick Moyer will give a joint concert Friday, March 18 at 8 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium at Methodist College. Admission is free and the public is invited.

The Green and Moyer concert is the ninth of 15 that will be given in the state during March, all part of the Paul Green Centennial Tour. The artists are the grandchildren of Paul Green, the North Carolina playwright who wrote *The Lost Colony*. March 17 marks the 100th anniversary of Green's birth in Harnett County.

Musical compositions included on the program are: Rachmaninoff's "Sonata in g minor for Piano and Cello," Beethoven's "12 variations from Mozart's 'Magic Flute'," Brahms' "Three Hungarian Dances, and works by Kenneth De Falla and Kenneth Frazelle.

Nancy Green is an active chamber musician who lives in London and teaches at the Guildhall School of Music. She has performed at Carnegie Recital Hall, in the Boston Symphony "Pops" concerts, and on other concert stages in America, England, Germany, and Spain. A student of the Julliard School of Music, Ms. Green has also recorded a solo album and two collaborations with pianist Frederick Moyer.

Pianist Frederick Moyer received his musical training at the Curtis Institute of Philadelphia and at the University of Indiana/Bloomington. He has appeared as a soloist with many of America's major orchestras—Cleveland, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Boston, Dallas; with the Japan and Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestras; and at the Marlboro and Tanglewood festivals. His nine recordings (on the GM and Jupiter labels) reflect his wide-ranging repertoire and comprise works of composers from three centuries.

The Green/Moyer concert is being sponsored jointly by the Paul Green Foundation and the Methodist College Foundation.


