METHODIST COLLEGE TO EXHIBIT WORKS OF PAUL LANIER, JR.

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Methodist College Art Department will present an art exhibit of works by Paul Lanier, Jr. October 9—November 11 in the college's Mallett-Rogers House Art Gallery.

Entitled "Continuum", the exhibit will include 32 small drawings, four large drawings, and several paintings by the Fayetteville artist. Lanier is primarily known for his drawings; prismacolor pencil is his preferred medium.

Lanier, 34, is a native of Chicago who has been drawing since he was six. He attended the Chicago Vocational High School where he learned printmaking techniques, figure drawing, architectural drawing, graphic design and illustration. After high school, he completed an apprenticeship program in illustration, worked for an advertising agency, and did free-lance illustrations.

The artist served in the Army from 1985-89. He now works as an illustrator for Champion Sportswear in Dunn; he also spends about six hours each day drawing or painting in his studio at home. His work was shown locally during a 1994 exhibit of African masks at the Arts Center and his drawing "Poseidon" won First Place in the Cape Fear Studio's 1993 Artists Exhibition. His work has been cited for excellence at art competitions in Fayetteville, Greensboro, and Raleigh.

He describes his upcoming show as "fresh, varied, and lively." He said the show "Continuum" is his commentary on "humankind's fundamental spiritual connection with the infinite," and reflects his view that "life does not begin or end. It continues."

Lanier's themes and subjects are surrealistic. "I'm fascinated by the world of dreams," he said during a recent interview.

"Methodist is proud to sponsor this exhibit," said Peggy Hinson, associate professor of art. "Paul is a gifted artist with a very original style."

Lanier's exhibit opens Sunday, October 9 with a public reception. His exhibit will be open Monday-Friday from 2-4 p.m. through November 11.
