DR. WALTER WEAVER TO DISCUSS 'THE HISTORICAL JESUS' AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. Walter Weaver, Pendergrass Professor of Religion at Florida Southern College, will deliver two lectures on "The Quest of the Historical Jesus" October 21 at Methodist College. There is no charge and the public is invited.

Dr. Weaver's lectures are the first in the Samuel J. and Norma C. Womack Endowed Lecture Series, named in honor of the Methodist's former academic dean and the late Mrs. Womack, who served for many years as director of library services at the college. The lectures are slated for 1 p.m. and 7 p.m. in Hendsdale Chapel.

In his 1 p.m. lecture, Dr. Weaver will discuss "Albert Schweitzer and the Historical Jesus." In his 7 p.m. lecture, the guest speaker will explore the topic, "From Schweitzer to the Jesus Seminar."

Dr. Weaver will draw heavily from research gleaned for a forthcoming three-volume work entitled, Historical Jesus in the Twentieth Century. He is currently collaborating with Professor Ernst Baasland of the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Oslo, Norway and Professor James H. Charlesworth of Princeton Theological Seminary on that work.

Dr. Weaver has taught religion and philosophy at Florida Southern College since 1972. He previously served as an assistant professor and chaplain at Greensboro College and as a United Methodist minister in Adelphia, N.J. and Durham, N. C. He holds a Ph.D. from Drew University and B.D. and A.B. degrees from Duke University. Walter Weaver is the son of Dr. L. Stacy Weaver, the first president of Methodist College.

The Womack Endowed Lecture Series will support a guest lecture by a religion scholar once each semester.

METHODIST COLLEGE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION HONORS FOUR

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Methodist College Alumni Association presented distinguished service awards to four persons at the homecoming dinner October 22.

Mr. R. Parker Wilson, Distinguished Service Professor of History, received the Outstanding Faculty Award. Mr. Wilson has taught at Methodist for the last 30 years. A native of Granite Falls, NC and a graduate of Wake Forest University and George Peabody College, Parker Wilson has taught "Western Civilization" and other history courses to more than 8,000 students at Methodist.

Mr. Wilson has a special love for theatre and the arts and has acted in more than 80 productions of the Cape Fear Regional Theatre (formerly Fayetteville Little Theatre). During the college's first decade, he directed most of the plays produced by Methodist's Green and Gold Masque Keys. He has also served as faculty advisor to *Small Talk* and Omicron Delta Kappa.

Maj. Gen. James Link '66 was named Distinguished Alumnus of 1994. He is currently the commander of the U.S. Army Missile Command at Redstone Arsenal in Huntsville, Alabama. During his 27 years in the Army, Maj. Gen. Link has received numerous decorations and has served as a company commander in Saudi Arabia, Germany and Vietnam. His parents live in Fayetteville.

Mr. George Small '82, former Associate Director of Admissions at Methodist, was named recipient of the Outstanding Alumni Service Award. During six of his eight years in the Admissions Office Small recruited students from Virginia to New England. He left Methodist last summer to pursue a master's degree in clinical psychology at Alfred University in New York.

In a special presentation, the MCAA Board of Directors honored the late Howard Lupton '72, by unveiling the Methodist College Alumni Association Presidents Plaque and dedicating it to his memory. A two-term president of the alumni association, Mr. Lupton died in January. His widow, Vicki Bullock Lupton; son Greg; father, Rev. James Lupton; and other family members were recognized. The plaque now hangs in the Alumni Dining Room, Berns Student Center.
