# METHODIST COLLEGE DEBATERS TAKE TOP HONORS AT JAMES MADISON UNIVERSITY

**FAYETTEVILLE, N.C.**—Julie Kahl and Billie Martin, two members of the Methodist College Debate Team, won the Novice Division of the James Madison University Invitational Debate Tournament November 4-6. Kahl and Martin defeated a team from the U.S. Naval Academy to win the division title.

Three teams from Methodist competed in two divisions. All three teams received awards after qualifying for and advancing in the elimination rounds.

The tournament consisted of 78 teams representing 25 schools from 12 states, debating this year's national topic, "Resolved: That the federal government should substantially change rules and/or statutes governing criminal procedure in federal courts in one or more of the following areas: pretrial detention, sentencing."

In the Novice Division, the team of Billie Martin and Julie Kahl and the team of Liz Guzman and Ha Quach advanced to the elimination rounds. The team of Martin/Kahl completed the preliminary competition with a 5-1 record and Guzman/Quach compiled a 4-2 record. In the octofinal rounds they defeated Liberty University and the U.S. Naval Academy respectively to advance to quarterfinals.

In quarterfinals the Methodist teams were paired against each other and the team of Kahl/Martin was advanced, without debating, based on its preliminary record. In the semifinal debate, Kahl/Martin defeated a team from George Mason University on a 2-1 decision to advance to finals, where they defeated the top team from the U.S. Naval Academy on a 2-1 decision to win the tournament.

Debate Coach John E. Humphreys was extremely pleased with the results. "Our program is very new," he said. "This was the first time we have ever advanced more than one team in a tournament, our first junior varsity award, and of course, our first championship in a major tournament. Coming on the heels of last year's fifth place finish at nationals, I think it shows that the Methodist program is growing in both size and competitiveness."

In the junior varsity division, the team of Todd Lyden and Thomas Wooldridge completed the preliminary competition with a 4-2 win-loss record and qualified for the octofinal elimination round. In the elimination rounds they advanced to the quarterfinal round after defeating a team from Liberty University on a 2-1 decision. This was the first tournament in which Methodist College has advanced a team in the Junior Varsity Division.

# METHODIST COLLEGE RECEIVES EHRENSBERGER AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATIONAL SERVICES TO U.S. ARMED FORCES

**FAYETTEVILLE, NC--**Methodist College has received the prestigious Ray Ehrensberger Institution of the Year Award, given by the Commission on Military Education for the American Association of Adult and Continuing Education.

Methodist was commended for "establishing and maintaining outstanding support for soldiers of the U.S. Army's XVIII ABN Corps and for Fort Bragg family members, civilian employees, and the total educational system of the United States armed forces." The award is named for the late Ray Ehrensberger, who as dean of continuing education at the University of Maryland, designed a worldwide network of educational services for military personnel.

Dr. Eldridge Starling, Education Services Officer at Fort Bragg, nominated Methodist College for the award, citing the college's high quality liberal arts program, friendly but business-like attitude toward military students, participation in the Army's Green to Gold officer training program, and the college's Albritton-Hurley Military Scholarship.

Dr. Starling presented the award to Dr. M. Elton Hendricks, college president, November 18, 1994. Dr. Hendricks expressed his appreciation to Dr. Starling and Mr. Ernest J. Morine, Operations Manager for Education Services at Fort Bragg's Army Education Center, and said Methodist's faculty and staff deserve most of the credit for the award.

Bobby Tuggle, director of Methodist's Fort Bragg office, said the Ray Ehrensberger Institution of the Year Award is a great honor for Methodist, "because we competed worldwide with colleges and universities offering educational services to the military." Mr. Tuggle and two other employees—Andy Edmundson and Christine Summers—staff Methodist's Fort Bragg office.

Methodist and the other nominees for the Ehrensberger Award were evaluated by a U. S. Department of Defense committee, using a variety of criteria: academic programs offered day and evening, financial assistance awarded to Dept. of Defense personnel (active duty and civilian), admission policies, academic counseling, campus security, compliance with all rules and regulations associated with Servicemembers Opportunity Colleges, college credit awarded to military personnel through the American Council on Education, student support facilities (i.e. library, bookstore, business office, registrar, computer labs), and continuity of support services.

Methodist generated over 1,500 student enrollments in 1993-94 among Fort Bragg personnel. Military students make up approximately half of Methodist's evening enrollment of 600 and approximately 8 percent of the regular day enrollment of 1,200.
