USPTA ACCREDITS METHODIST COLLEGE PROGRAM

FAYETTEVILLE, N.C.—The United States Professional Tennis Association granted accreditation to Methodist College's Professional Tennis Management Program December 7.

Directed by Dr. Theresa Warrell, the program combines a major in business administration from the Reeves School of Business with a concentration in professional tennis management. Through classes, workshops, and internships, students are prepared for careers as tennis professionals.

"We are proud to be associated with the USPTA," said Dr. Warrell. "Accreditation shows the world that our program meets the standards of excellence set by the world's oldest and largest trade association for tennis-teaching professionals."

Methodist's program is the fifth in the U.S. to be accredited by the USPTA, but only the third offered by a four-year college.* Accreditation standards require that Methodist's PTM graduates complete 30 weeks of internships and pass the USPTA certification exam.

Since its inception in 1988, Methodist's PTM program has placed 100 percent of its graduates in jobs as tennis professionals. Three 10-week internships, one each summer, put students in touch with tennis professionals in both the U.S. and abroad. In addition, a tennis professional visits the campus each semester to present an educational seminar to PTM students.

Dr. Warrell and her assistant Tom Maze, a Methodist College graduate, are both certified professionals. Having received USPTA accreditation, they said their next goal is to enroll more students. They are also looking forward to Spring 1995, when the college will begin construction of the Richard L. Player, Sr. Golf and Tennis Learning Center.

CHARLIE GADDY ASKS WINTER GRADUATES TO "MAKE A DIFFERENCE"

FAYETTEVILLE, N.C.—Winter graduates of Methodist College were challenged December 16 to make a difference in the world by voting, serving their communities, and showing concern for others.

The commencement speaker was Charlie Gaddy, former news anchor at WRAL-TV in Raleigh and a former trustee of Methodist College. He said today's college graduates have the power to make the world of tomorrow much better than it is today.

In the first half of his speech, Mr. Gaddy discussed the importance of the press in a free society—as a watchdog over government and a conveyor of truth and vital information. He decried the "confounding arrogance" shown by some in the news business and "a dangerous turn" in television news toward "show business techniques," as exemplified in programs like A Current Affair or Inside Edition. Mr. Gaddy said the press can stand some self-analysis and criticism, and that consumers should make their views known to their local newspapers and TV stations.

December graduates were also addressed by Reverend Tommy Smith, Fayetteville District Superintendent, North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. Reverend Smith said the graduates would be tempted in the world, just as Jesus was tempted in the desert following his baptism.

"Remember your river experience," he said. "You'll need it to live through the tough times. Remember your faith and aspirations...Jesus said pay attention to what's inside, that which won't let you rest or give up...Faith is what holds us together."

Methodist College awarded degrees to 98 persons at its winter commencement. Dr. Elton Hendricks, college president, also presented two honorary doctorates—a Doctor of Divinity to Reverend John Thomas "Tommy" Smith of Fayetteville, and a Doctor of Humanities to Mr. Charlie Gaddy of Raleigh.

Dr. Hendricks presented the Sam Edwards Award to Ricky Darwin John, denoting his selection as the outstanding Evening College student of 1994.

Mrs. Julia Abner, a native of Cuba, presented a Cuban flag to the college. Since 1985, foreign-born graduates have presented the flags of 40 nations to Methodist College at the spring and winter commencements.

Thirty-seven members of the winter class graduated with honors—16 "cum laude," 11 "magna cum laude," and 10 "summa cum laude."
