**METHODIST COLLEGE ANNOUNCES LURA S. TALLY CENTER FOR LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT**

**FAYETTEVILLE, NC**—Methodist College has established the Lura S. Tally Center for Leadership Development, honoring the Fayetteville legislator who recently retired after 22 years' service in the North Carolina General Assembly.

Dr. Elton Hendricks, college president, announced today that the center will develop student leadership potential through a three or four-year interdisciplinary program of course work, campus and community service, and off-campus internships. Participants will earn 21 semester hours of credit and an academic minor in leadership.

Dr. Hendricks said the Lura Tally Center will help perpetuate the spirit of strong leadership given to the Fayetteville community and to the state by Mrs. Tally, a former public school teacher and counselor who served five terms in the N. C. House of Representatives and six terms in the N. C. Senate. A graduate of Duke University and N. C. State University, Mrs. Tally authored important legislation in the fields of environmental protection, juvenile detention, day care, and public education. Methodist College awarded her an honorary Doctor of Humanities degree in May 1989.

Twenty-five students—freshmen and sophomores—will enter Methodist's leadership development program this fall and 30 more will be added each year until enrollment reaches 120. Dr. Suzan K. Cheek, associate professor of political science, will serve as program coordinator and recruit students for the program. The Tally Center will also bring a leadership expert to campus for two days each semester to conduct special workshops.

Dr. Cheek and a group of faculty and administrators spent the past two years developing the concept. The Methodist College Board of Trustees approved the program in October 1994. Students selected for the program will take three core courses in leadership, two practicums (one on campus, one in the local community), three electives from a list of existing courses, and complete a senior internship with a government agency, nonprofit organization, or business.

“This is an opportunity for students to formally synthesize the leadership skills that the Methodist College experience makes available for them,” said Dr. Cheek. “Sen. Tally is the epitome of responsible public service and selfless leadership. We are grateful for the opportunity to honor her with this program and are confident that participants will become prominent contributors to their respective communities, including Fayetteville and Cumberland County.”

Mrs. Tally said she is “very honored” that Methodist’s Center for Leadership Development will bear her name. She also offered the following thoughts: “I’m particularly interested that young people understand that leadership comes from a great deal of education, a knowledge of what has gone on in the past, and an ability to express concerns for what will be needed in the future. I think it’s important for students to get an early understanding of government, to learn how to debate issues, and to help others understand what is at risk during times of change.”

**BILL LOWDERMILK HONORED BY SOUTHEASTERN JURISDICTION, UNITED METHODIST CHURCH**

**FAYETTEVILLE, N.C.**—Rev. Bill Lowdermilk, vice president for church/community relations at Methodist College, was recently notified of his selection as 1994 jurisdictional winner of the Francis Asbury Award for Fostering United Methodist Ministries in Higher Education.

Having received the Francis Asbury Award from the North Carolina Annual Conference last June, Rev. Lowdermilk joined five other nominees for the Asbury Award in the Southeastern Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church. Given annually by the Division of Higher Education's Office of Annual Conference Relations, the award recognizes individuals who faithfully continue to guide and serve the church in ministries to and with the learning community.

In 1990, Bill Lowdermilk's program of church relations was recognized by the church's University Senate as "one of our best models." He has held seminars for campus ministers at Lake Junaluska and Greensboro College, showing in detail how he has promoted Methodist College in the North Carolina Conference.

Bill Lowdermilk is completing his 32nd year at Methodist College, where he has served as assistant director of public relations, director of public relations, assistant to the president, and vice president. A native of Richmond County, he holds an A.B. degree from Emory University, an M. Div. degree from Duke Divinity School, and a Doctor of Divinity degree from North Carolina Wesleyan College.
