PIANIST, SOPRANO TO GIVE RECITAL AT METHODIST COLLEGE

Mrs. Guthrie and Mrs. Gardiner will perform works by Beethoven, Schubert, Obradors, Verdi, Lippé, and Mendelssohn. They will be assisted by Polly Benton, pianist, and J. Michael Rogers, clarinetist.

Diane Guthrie will sing Schubert's solo cantata "The Shepherd on the Rock," Spanish folk songs by Rodrigo and Obradors, love songs by Ernest Gold and Edouard Lippé, and excerpts from Verdi's opera *La Triviata*.

An adjunct instructor of voice and music appreciation, Diane Guthrie holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from UNC-Greensboro, a Master of Music in Vocal Performance from Florida State University, and a Bachelor of Music in Music Education from Queens College. METHODIST COLLEGE DEBATE TEAM WINS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Methodist College Debate Team finished first in the Novice Division of the American Debate Association's National Championship held March 10-12 at Boston College.

The team of Julie Kahl and Ha Quach defeated the No. 1 seed—George Mason University—on a 3-0 decision in the quarterfinals. The Methodist team won five rounds to get to the final bracket of 16 teams, defeating teams from James Madison University (semifinals) and Liberty University (finals).

A total of 47 teams, representing 27 schools, competed in two divisions, Novice and Junior Varsity.

Two teams from Methodist competed—Julie Kahl and Ha Quach in the Novice Division and Todd

Lyden and Thomas Wooldridge in the Junior Varsity Division. Lyden and Wooldridge finished 4-4.

Methodist's novice debaters have had an excellent year. Last November, Julie Kahl and Billie Martin won the James Madison Invitational Tournament, defeating a team from the U.S. Naval Academy on a 2-1 decision.

Debate Coach John Humphreys, currently in his second year at Methodist, was delighted with the Kahl/Quach performance at nationals and with Methodist's mid-year National Debate Tournament ranking of 28th among 78 college teams in the nation. In NDT District 6, which includes 12 schools from seven southeastern states, Methodist was ranked fourth, behind Wake Forest, Emory, and Georgia.

The team ranking is based on cumulative points scored in each school's top eight performances. "I think these results are good," said Humphreys, "But because the bigger schools go to eight or more tournaments in a semester they have more opportunities to win. They can count only the best of their eight performances. We only attended four tournaments and achieved a competitive ranking. I feel if we had attended a full eight tournaments, we would have placed higher."

METHODIST BECOMES FASTEST-GROWING PRIVATE COLLEGE IN N. C.

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Methodist College is now the fastest-growing private college in North Carolina.

During the Fall 1994 semester, Methodist College recorded the largest enrollment gain among the state's 37 independent colleges and universities.

Methodist gained 206 students over Fall 1993, reaching a record enrollment of 1,907 in its day and evening programs. In-state enrollment increased by 113 students and out-of-state enrollment increased by 93 students.

"New curricula, increased visibility and reputation, new marketing strategies, and hard work by our recruiters and other staff have combined to make Methodist College better known and more attractive to prospective students," noted Dr. M. Elton Hendricks, college president. "We are excited by these developments and we are planning for future growth."

Eighteen of the state's 37 independent college and universities recorded enrollment gains last fall, according to data released by the North Carolina Center for Independent Higher Education in Raleigh. Methodist led with 206, followed by Elon College with 175, Livingstone College with 145, and Wake Forest University with 102.

SAFETY: Safety must be the first consideration in all situations involving Airborne Adventures operations. Federal Aviation Administration Rules and Regulations (FARs) are specific regarding the safe performance of any aircraft. To ensure a safe AD-Venture, your FAA certified pilot's judgment calls are final.

PROCEDURES FOR BALLOON RENTAL:

Call (313) 485-7742 to make reservations to rent the Airborne AD-Ventures Hot Air Balloon.

Your Balloon Pilot will contact you or your designated passenger(s) to confirm the time and location of the event.

A free flight typically lasts 1 to $1^{-1}/_2$ hours, and a tethered balloon promotion typically lasts 2-3 hours. Your pilot determines weather acceptable for safe operation.

DEPOSIT:

Scheduling the balloon requires a \$100.00 deposit.

COSTS:

A free flight AD-Venture costs \$150.00 per passenger. Two passengers normally fly on each flight. Payment is due at the time of the flight.

Tethered AD-Ventures cost \$350.00 for the first hour, \$250.00 for the second hour, and \$200.00 for each additional hour. Airborne Ad-Ventures will bill you after the event.

Advertising banners, logoed or special occasion, are also available. Ask your pilot for more information.

The person or organization tenting the balloon is responsible for additional insurance charges when required.

If the pilot travels outside the Detroit Metro area, there is an additional charge of \$.30 per mile. If the pilot stays overnight, the person or organization renting the halloon agrees to pay for accommodations and meals.

If the pilot is unable to inflate the balloon at the event due to weather or other conditions, the person or organization renting the balloon agrees to pay a \$100.00 weather out fee. There will be no charge if you contact the pilot before the AD-Venture, thereby preventing unnecessary travel. Cancel the AD-Venture a minimum of one week in advance for reasons other than bad weather.

BALLOON RESTRICTIONS:

The Hot Air Balloon requires a launch area of 200' x 200' free of powerlines or other obstacles.

The person or organization renting the balloon is responsible to obtain written permission from the property owner hosting the AD-Venture.

Your pilot will approve launch and tether sites in advance. A tethered AD-Venture requires stable objects to tie tether ropes, i.e., trees, poles, or vehicles.

Free flights occur between surrise and two hours after surrise; and between two hours before sunset and sunset. Winds must be ten miles per hour or less.

Schedule tethered AD-Ventures during early morning or evening hours in winds of 6-7 mph or less. Mid-afternoon tethers are possible but there an increased chance of higher winds and other conditions that may affect safe halloon operations.

Any advertising you do for a free flight or tethered AD-Venture should always state "WEATHER PERMITTING". Such a qualification is simply good public relations.
