**FAYETTEVILLE, NC**—The Methodist College Chorus, under the direction of Alan Porter, will present its spring concert Tuesday, April 11 at 8 p.m. at Reeves Auditorium. Admission is free.

The 30-member chorus will perform a varied program, which includes classical, gospel, and popular selections. One of the most interesting works is an *a capella* setting "Magnificat" by Arvo Pärt, a contemporary Estonian composer.

The smaller ensembles—Rainbow's End and The Monarch Quartet—will perform separately. The chorus will be accompanied by Marie Lakin, a junior piano performance major.

The current repertoire of this talented group of students is quite varied including such diverse works as "Cantate" by Noel Goemanne, the spiritual "Lord, I Don't Feel Noways Tired" and "O Bone Jesu" by the early 16th century Flemish composer Loyset Compere. (

The program also includes, among other titles, <sup>the Oscar winning "Can You Feel the Love Tonight"</sup> ~~the Bach choral fugue "All Breathing Life, Sing and Praise~~ <sup>Gershwin's "I'll Build</sup> ~~ye the Lord"~~ <sup>Paradise"</sup> and a powerful Gospel song entitled "He Has the

a Stairway to

Power". One of the most interesting works on the program is the a cappella setting of "Magnificat" by Arvo Pärt, a contemporary Estonian composer.

The Methodist College Chorus is a select group of thirty individuals chosen by audition for their personality, moral character, and leadership qualities, as well as for their exceptional talent in music. It is well known for its spirited rendition of many types of music. ( Past programs have included a country music medley with contemporary and popular selections, as well as standard classical repertoire. Major works performed by the Chorus in recent years include Stravinsky's Symphony of Psalms, the music for a play about outdoor dramatist Paul Green entitled Listen To My Song, Cecil Effinger's The Invisible Fire, and Mozart's Solemn Vespers.

Alan Porter, the Chair of the Music Department and Director of the Fine Arts Division at Methodist College, is in his thirty-first year as conductor of the Chorus. A native of Pennsylvania, Mr. Porter received a Bachelor of Music degree (cum laude) from Mount



Union College and a Master of Music degree with performance honors from the University of Illinois. In addition to being an active recitalist and a clinician, he is in demand as conductor and music director at local theaters and schools. Most recently, he prepared a community choir for the famous arranger-conductor Jester Hairston. Mr. Porter is the conductor and Music director of the Cumberland Oratorio Singers, which has recently performed the Haydn Creation, the Brahms German Requiem and King David by Arthur Honegger.

The Chorus is accompanied by Marie Lakin, a Methodist College junior Piano Performance Major. Marie is also the pianist and director of The Monarch Quartet, one of two smaller ensembles which perform frequently with the chorus. The other is Rainbow's End, a mixed group of six singers and a pianist. These groups are extremely busy, performing frequently at churches, schools and service clubs throughout eastern North Carolina.

Chorus officers for the 1994-95 academic year are as follows: President, Dwayne Walter, a junior Music Education Major; Vice-President, Marie Lakin, a junior Piano Performance Major; Secretary, Bethany Surridge, a senior Music Education major, Treasurer, Dena Briggs, a senior Music Education major, Wardrobe Officer, Candice Patrick, a senior Vocal Performance major and Historian, Jodi Owen, a sophomore Communications major. Some of the responsibilities of the officers include representing the Chorus on and off campus, organizing fund-raising activities, and helping plan the spring tour and other activities.

**METHODIST COLLEGE HONORS DUNN BUSINESSMAN**

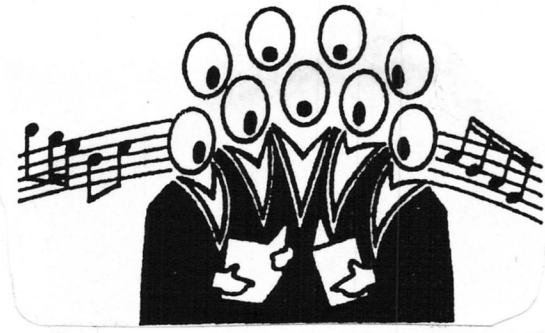
**FAYETTEVILLE, NC**—The Center for Entrepreneurship at Methodist College has named James Patrick “Pat” Godwin, president and founder of Godwin Manufacturing Co., the recipient of its 14th annual Silver Spoon Award.

Mr. Godwin received the award April 6 at the college’s 18th annual Stock Market Symposium. The Silver Spoon Award honors individuals who, “although not born to wealth and status, have distinguished themselves by significant economic achievement and accomplishment.”

This year’s recipient was cited for his entrepreneurial skill in designing and building a variety of truck equipment, from car carriers to snow-moving equipment to roll-off refuse containers. Mr. Godwin established Godwin Manufacturing in 1972 as a successor to Godwin Welding which he founded in 1966. His firm currently employs 155 persons.

Mr. Godwin is a member of the Dunn Planning Board, the Dunn Area Chamber of Commerce, the Board of Directors of Triangle Bankcorp, and the Glad Tidings Assemblies of God Church.

During a brief acceptance speech, Mr. Godwin said his success was the result of hard work, good employees, and “giving his life to the Lord.” He said Godwin Manufacturing is now the largest supplier of snow moving equipment on the East Coast and the 3rd largest truck equipment manufacturer in the world.

**CUMBERLAND ORATORIO SINGERS ANNOUNCE SOLOISTS FOR APRIL "ELIJAH"**

**FAYETTEVILLE, NC**—The Cumberland Oratorio Singers, under the direction of Alan M. Porter, will present Felix Mendelssohn's dramatic oratorio *Elijah* Sunday April 30 at 3 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium.

This work will be performed by an 80-voice chorus, full orchestra, and prominent guest soloists. There is no admission charge for this event.

Tenor John Daniecki, who was a soloist in last fall's COS production of Honegger's *King David*, returns to the Reeves stage. Mr. Daniecki has had a busy career in opera, oratorio and symphony performances since his debut in 1986.

A Raleigh resident, he is a graduate of Northwestern University and Juilliard. Mr. Daniecki has been featured in the New York City Opera, Lyric Opera of Kansas City, the Wolf Trap Opera, and most recently in the Florentine Opera's *The Barber of Seville* and with the Atlanta Symphony in *Carmina Burana*.

Wesley Rowell, Fayetteville native and Methodist College alumnus, is the featured bass soloist. Well-remembered for his fine work in the 1993 COS production of Haydn's *The Creation*, Mr. Rowell has performed the major oratorios of Bach, Handel, Haydn, Mozart, Fauré and Bruckner with various symphony orchestras, including Fayetteville, Durham, and Toledo.

A winner of the 1991 Metropolitan Opera National Council district auditions, he has performed with Chamber Opera Chicago, the Toledo Opera, and Illinois Opera Theater in *The Marriage of Figaro*, *Porgy and Bess*, *La Bohème*, and *The Magic Flute*.

Mezzo-soprano Anna Perry Gosnell debuts with the Cumberland Oratorio Singers. She has won critical acclaim for her performance of Aaron Copeland's *In The Beginning* at the Spoleto Festival in Charleston, S.C. and has performed extensively in oratorios such as

Mozart's *Requiem* and Bach's *The Passion According to St. Matthew*.

Ms. Gosnell is a native of Augusta, Ga. and a graduate of Winthrop College and the Brevard Music Center. She currently resides in Charlotte, N.C. where she has been featured with the Charlotte Symphony and Oratorio Singers of Charlotte in Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony*, Mozart's *Solemn Vespers*, and Haydn's *Lord Nelson Mass*.

Soprano Marika Kyriakos, a resident of Goldsboro, N.C., is a multi-talented performing artist with a degree in piano performance and a doctorate in vocal performance from the University of Texas at Austin. This is her first performance with the Cumberland Oratorio singers. Ms. Kyriakos has performed with the Greater New England Opera Company and the opera companies of the University of Missouri in Kansas City and Columbia, Mo. She has appeared in Rossini's *The Barber of Seville*, and *Così fan Tutte* by Mozart, *The Saint of Bleeker Street* by Menotti and *Le Nozze di Figaro*, also by Mozart.

Currently a member of Goldsboro Oratorio chorus, she has performed numerous works in recital and as guest soloist in such works as *Magnificat* by Vivaldi and *Mass in G Minor* by Ralph Vaughn Williams. She teaches voice and piano privately and has served on the faculty of the University of Missouri at Kansas City, the University of Texas at Austin, and high schools in Austin, Tex.

Several minor solo roles will feature soloists from within the ranks of the Cumberland Oratorio Singers. Alto Joyce Lipe will perform as the evil Queen Jezebel. John Watkins, bass, will sing the role of King Ahab. Janine McNeil, Victoria Phillips, and Su Vick will be featured as angel voices in a solo trio, and Jean Pylant, Leslie B. Craig, Jody Miller, and Ruth Miner are the angelic solo quartet.

Thomas Cizek, featured in Honegger's *King David* as the young King David, will sing as a youth in *Elijah*. He is a seventh grader at St. Patrick's School.
