Mrs. Taylor has been active in professional organizations, her church, and the sorority Alpha Kappa Alpha. She has worked as a tutor with the Upward Bound and Summer Migrant programs, and writes inspirational poetry as a hobby. She and her husband Dwight, a teacher and coach at Hunt High, are the parents of a six-month-old daughter.

INACOMP EXECUTIVE PRESENTS GIFT TO METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Johnny Dawkins, president of Inacomp Computer Center and chair of the Fayetteville Chamber of Commerce, made the first corporate gift to the Lura S. Tally Center for Leadership Development today at Methodist College.

Mr. Dawkins presented a Compaq 4666 personal computer system, with hard drive, color monitor, fax modem, and four popular software programs. He said he felt a personal obligation as chamber president to do something for the Tally Center, the first of its kind in this region. "I wanted to make the first corporate gift," he said. "This is one of the most important things I will do as president."

The Lura S. Tally Center for Leadership Development, which opened this fall with 20 students, offers a three or four-year interdisciplinary program leading to an academic minor in leadership. It is named for a Fayetteville educator and civic leader who served five terms in the N.C. House of Representatives and six terms in the N.C. Senate. Dr. Suzan Cheek, associate professor of political science at Methodist College, is the program coordinator.

"In this gift," said Dr. Cheek, "our leadership students see a leader giving to his community. They will learn many skills through the hands-on applications that this sophisticated machine makes possible. We are deeply grateful to Johnny Dawkins and his leadership of the business community for this first corporate gift to the Tally Center."

Dr. Cheek said Tally leadership students and faculty will use the new computer for decisionmaking simulations and exercises, word processing, Internet communication, and to build databases for statistical analysis.


