MONARCH PLAYMAKERS TO STAGE 'THE VELVETEEN RABBIT'

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Monarch Playmakers at Methodist College will present *The Velveteen Rabbit* Nov. 15-19 in Reeves Auditorium.

The college's fourth annual holiday show for children is a musical adaptation of a story by Marjorie Williams. It is a musical fantasy depicting the love between a young boy and a stuffed rabbit that longs to be real. The story deals with learning how to love unconditionally, accepting new people and experiences, and making friends.

"We wanted a play that concentrated on the actors," said director Phoebe Hall. "It is a classic story that everyone will enjoy. The songs by Larry Nestor are lively and entertaining."

Bethany Surridge, a senior from Fayetteville, will play the Velveteen Rabbit and Sam Williams, a junior from Burlington, will play the young boy. Other Methodist College students with roles in the production are: Amanda Evans as the Fantasy Fairy, Summer Gilmore as Clockwork Mouse, Robert Devlin as Skin Horse, and Denise Shuey as Second Real Rabbit. Cynthia Devos, a Fayetteville youngster, is cast as First Real Rabbit.

Performances of *The Velveteen Rabbit* are slated for Nov. 17 at 7 p.m., Nov. 18 at 4 and 7 p.m., and Nov. 19 at 2 p.m. The school matinees—three on Nov. 15 and three on Nov. 16—are filled. Admission is \$3 for children and senior citizens and \$6 for adults.

METHODIST COLLEGE RECEIVES RARE BUST OF JOHN WESLEY

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Mrs. Vergil Queen of Raleigh has presented Methodist College with a rare Kent bust of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism.

Made of Staffordshire pottery around 1791, the miniature bust is based on a clay model of Wesley fashioned by Enoch Wood in 1784. Wesley was 81 years old and reportedly “wearing his best wig” when he sat for Wood on five different occasions. The end result was said to be a striking and lifelike portrayal of Wesley’s head and face, one that pleased Wesley and his friends and influenced later sculptors and painters.

The bust owned by Rev. Vergil Queen was purchased for him by the Rev. Chancey Barclift in the 1960s. Rev. Barclift owned a similar bust of Wesley which he had purchased from the estate of an English preacher in the 1930’s. (Barclift’s daughter Thelma and her husband, Dr. Harold Crowder, of South Boston, Va., have collected over 200 busts and figurines of John Wesley since World War II.)

Mrs. Queen’s latest gift to Methodist will become part of the Vergil Queen Collection of books, journals, and other collectibles given earlier this year to Davis Memorial Library. Along with the bust, the college received Arthur Cummings’ illustrated book, *A Portrait in Pottery*, which describes the evolution of small pottery busts of Wesley which were made and sold in large numbers by English potters. The text of the book comes from a lecture given to the Wesley Historical Society in 1962.

Rev. Vergil Queen was a charter member of the Methodist College Board of Trustees and was considered an authority on the history of the Methodist Church and Wesleyan theology. Many of the books and journals in his personal library were acquired on trips to England.

Rev. Queen held six pastorates in the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church, was superintendent of the Wilmington and Sanford districts, and was the organizing pastor of Haymount United Methodist Church in Fayetteville. Since his death in 1993, Mrs. Frances Queen, his widow, has given the bulk of Rev. Queen’s library to Methodist College, she has also given items to his colleagues in the conference and to Westminster College, Oxford, England.

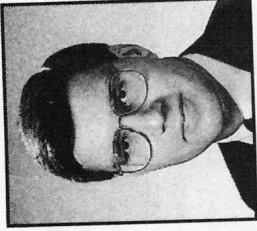

Johnny Dawkins is President and Chief Executive Officer of Inacom Computer Center of Fayetteville and Inacom Information Systems of Myrtle Beach. A native of Fayetteville, Dawkins graduated from Wake Forest University, and did postgraduate work at Campbell University Law School. Dawkins has served on the Inacom National Advisory Council, the Fayetteville State University Radio Advisory Council and Foundation Board, the Fayetteville Technical Community College Foundation Board, the Duke Medical Center's Brain Tumor Advisory Board, the Fayetteville Kiwanis Club Board, the Cumberland County Business Education Advisory Committee, and the Care Clinic Foundation Board. He currently is the Chair of the Fayetteville Chamber of Commerce.

J. Walter McDowell, President, Chief Executive Officer, and a director of Wachovia Bank of North Carolina, is based in Winston-Salem. METHODIST COLLEGE CHORUS SLATES WINTER CONCERT

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Methodist College Chorus, under the direction of Alan M. Porter, will present a winter concert Wednesday, Nov. 29 at 8 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium.

The 41-member chorus will perform a varied program entitled "Christ for the World We Sing," the same program the group will take to France next March in its first European concert tour.* French compositions by Fauré, Charpentier, and Messiaen will be interspersed with English/American anthems and spirituals.

Methodist's chorus and its vocal ensembles have had a busy schedule of fall concerts and fund-raisers, singing at Fayetteville's International Folk Festival and the Lafayette Society Banquet; at United Methodist churches in Raleigh, Carrboro, Burlington, Lillington, and Wilson; and at Southern Alamance High School in Graham. The group has washed cars, sold barbecue, and held a yard sale and walk-a-thon in efforts to raise half of an estimated tour cost of \$45,000.

Two vocal ensembles—The Rainbow's End and The Monarch Quartet—will perform independently during the winter concert. These groups are comprised of chorus members selected by audition. Marie Lakin serves as principal accompanist for the chorus and The Monarch Quartet. Jay Locklear accompanies The Rainbow's End.

* During their tour of France, the Methodist College Chorus will perform in Paris, Strasbourg, Mulhouse, and St. Avold—Fayetteville's sister city. Fayetteville Mayor J. L. Dawkins has designated the chorus as the city's official representative for the first educational exchange between Fayetteville and St. Avold. The governing bodies of the two cities entered a sister city agreement in September, 1993.
