DR. LLOYD BAILEY TO DELIVER PASTORS' DAY LECTURES AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. Lloyd Bailey will deliver the first annual Pastors' Day Lectures at Methodist College Thursday, April 25. His topic will be: "Prophets in Ancient Israel and Today."

A United Methodist minister, Dr. Bailey is Professor of Hebrew Bible at Duke Divinity School and Visiting Professor of Religion at Methodist College. Charles M. Reeves, Jr. (1919-1995)




