DR. LLOYD BAILEY TO DELIVER PASTORS' DAY LECTURES AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. Lloyd Bailey will deliver the first annual Pastors' Day Lectures at Methodist College Thursday, April 25. His topic will be: "Prophets in Ancient Israel and Today."

A United Methodist minister, Dr. Bailey is Professor of Hebrew Bible at Duke Divinity School and Visiting Professor of Religion at Methodist College. He has written articles and books on a wide range of topics: the Pentateuch; capital punishment; biblical perspectives on death; creationism; biblical translation; and regional Methodist Church history.

His lectures at Methodist will explore the following questions: Should the prophets be seen as predictors of recent events, social reformers, or poetic commentators on their own days? What is the relationship between the prophets' carefully constructed poetry and revelation? What were the prophets' purposes? Were they successful? Are there such figures today? What do the prophets have to teach contemporary ministers?

The lectures will be held at 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. in Hensdale Chapel. There is a \$6 registration fee which includes lunch. Pastors may register by contacting Dr. Tryon Lancaster (910) 630-7006 at Methodist College, 5400 Ramsey Street, Fayetteville, NC 28311.

Daytime courses will be offered in three different terms—Term I: May ~~15~~²⁰-June ~~7~~⁷;
Term II: June ~~12~~¹⁷-July ~~10~~¹⁵; Term III: July ~~11~~¹⁶-August ~~7~~¹². Day classes will meet every weekday
of each term. Registration for day classes opens May 1.

One term of Evening College will be offered from May ~~22~~²⁷-July ~~14~~¹⁹. Evening classes meet
either Monday and Wednesday or Tuesday and Thursday of each week. Registration for the
evening term opens May 8. (B)

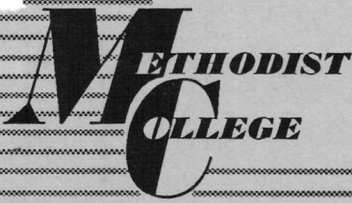

Charles M. Reeves, Jr. (1919-1995)

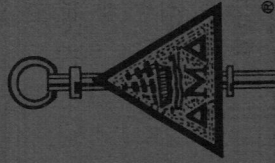

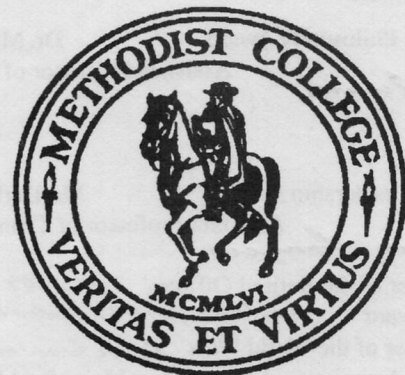

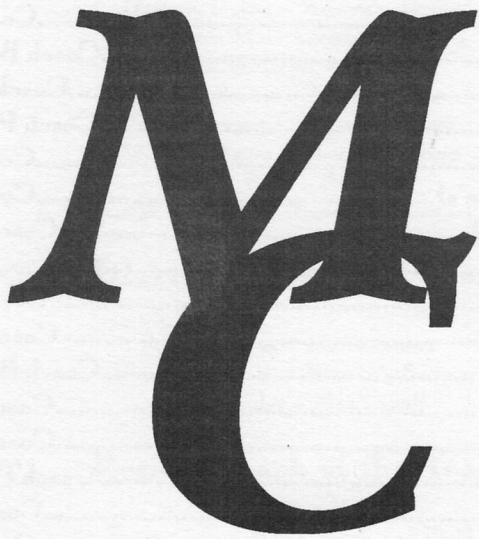
