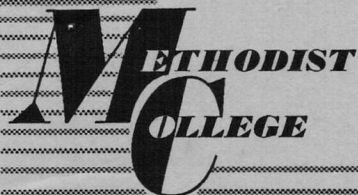

- 4) Black & white prints (AFTER SELECTION FROM CONTACT SHEET) can be done in 24-48 hours.
- 5) Color prints (AFTER SELECTION FROM CONTACT SHEET) normally take 4-5 working days.
- 6) Allow 48 hours for the return of SLIDES

DR. JAMES A. SANDERS TO LECTURE ON DEAD SEA SCROLLS, LUKE AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. James A. Sanders, professor of intertestamental and biblical studies at the School of Theology at Claremont, Ca., will deliver two lectures Friday, Oct. 18 at Methodist College.

The 11 a.m. lecture is entitled "The Dead Sea Scrolls Revisited." His 7 p.m. lecture will explore "Luke and Scripture." Both lectures will be held in Hensdale Chapel. They are free and open to the public.

Dr. Sanders is the fourth guest lecturer in the Samuel J. and Norma C. Womack Lecture Series which was inaugurated in October 1994. The series was endowed by friends of Dr. Sam Womack, former religion professor and academic dean at Methodist, and the late Mrs. Womack, who was director of library services at the college.

In addition to teaching biblical studies at STC, Dr. Sanders teaches religion at the Claremont Graduate School and serves as president of the Ancient Biblical Manuscript Center located on the STC campus. A graduate of Vanderbilt University and Hebrew Union College, he is the recipient of numerous awards and honorary degrees.

As past president of the Society of Biblical Literature, Dr. Sanders is the only American member of the United Bible Society's Hebrew Old Testament Text Critical Project. He unrolled and published the large Scroll of Psalms from Qumran Cave 11 in 1965 and 1967 and has amassed the world's best collection of films of the Dead Sea Scrolls for SCT's Ancient Biblical Manuscript Center. He has published 13 books, including the recent *Luke and Scripture* and *Paul and the Scriptures of Israel*. He has lectured at colleges, seminaries, and churches around the world.

**METHODIST COLLEGE THEATRE DEPT. PRESENTS 'THE TEMPEST' OCT. 3-6 IN
O'HANLON AMPHITHEATER**

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Methodist College Theatre Department will present *The Tempest*, William Shakespeare's "fantasy of magic, monsters, intrigue, and love" Oct. 3 -6 in O'Hanlon Amphitheater.

Dr. Paul Wilson, associate professor of theatre and speech, will direct the Shakespearean comedy. He has also designed the set for the play. Summer Gilmore, a sophomore from West End, N. C., is the stage manager.

Veteran actor Robert Bloodworth, associate professor communications at Methodist, will play the main character, Prospero. Shakespeare described this character as "the rightful Duke of Milan, wise and virtuous philosopher and most mighty magician."

Melissa Neese, a sophomore from Fayetteville, will play Miranda, Prospero's lovely daughter. Sara Trelease, a freshman from Valrico, Fl, plays Antonio, Prospero's wicked brother. Danny Harrington, a freshman from Fayetteville, plays Prince Ferdinand, son of the King of Naples and Miranda's love interest. Michelle Scarbrough, a junior from Spring Lake, plays Gonzalo, Prospero's loyal subject.

After Antonio seizes the dukedom from his brother, he sets Prospero and Miranda adrift in a boat. They land on an enchanted island occupied by Caliban, a "fish-like" monster played by Joel Stanford, a freshman from Fayetteville, and Ariel, a "tricksy, bird-like spirit" played by Matt Twiddy, a sophomore from Southern Shores, N. C.

After a ship manned by the enemies of Prospero is attacked by Ariel and forced to land on the island, Ariel lures Prince Ferdinand to the cave of Prospero and Miranda falls in love with him. All but Sebastian (Ruthie Miller) and Antonio are put to sleep by Ariel's magic; these two plot the death of Alonso, the King of Naples, played by Michael Crouse.

Meanwhile, on another part of the island, Caliban, Stephano (Mrs. Jill Austin), and Trinculo (Denise Shuey) plot to kill Prospero and seize the island, with Stephano becoming king and Miranda his queen-consort.

With the help of Ariel, Prospero stages a prenuptial pageant for Prince Ferdinand and

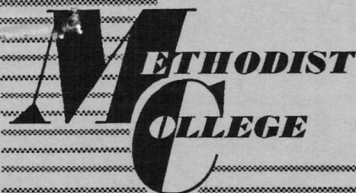

Miranda, confronts his enemies, and foils the plots against him and the King of Naples. All parties then set sail for home—Milan and Naples.

Dr. Wilson has condensed the play to fit within a two-hour time frame, but has rewritten none of it. He said everyone should enjoy the play, which he describes as a story about “growing up, not growing old.”

The Tempest will be staged Thursday-Saturday at 8 p.m. and Sunday at 2 p.m. Admission is \$6 for adults and \$3 for children and senior citizens.-

KRESGE FOUNDATION AWARDS METHODIST COLLEGE \$300,000 CHALLENGE GRANT

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Kresge Foundation, based in Troy, Michigan, has awarded Methodist College a \$300,000 challenge grant toward the construction of an addition to Davis Memorial Library.

The grant is contingent upon the college raising \$1,428,500—the amount needed to reach a \$6.5 million goal for the college's "Expanding the Vision" capital campaign—by Dec. 1, 1997. The campaign has five goals: \$1.9 million for an addition to the library, \$1 million for a new academic building, \$1,650,000 for ongoing support, \$1 million for the endowment, and \$1 million for a math and computer science building.

"We are delighted to receive this challenge grant from The Kresge Foundation," said Dr. Elton Hendricks, college president. "In 1989, a Kresge grant of \$250,000 helped us complete our "Come of Age" campaign to build the March F. Riddle (Physical Activities) Center. I am confident that we can raise \$1.4 million over the next 14 months and bring the "Expanding the Vision" campaign to a successful conclusion."

As of September 20, Methodist had received campaign gifts and pledges of \$4,928,427 or 75 percent of an overall goal of \$6,550,000. The college has \$980,110 in gifts and pledges for the library addition, which is 52 percent of the amount needed for that project. The campaign has already surpassed its goals for the endowment and the math and computer science building.

The Kresge Foundation makes grants to institutions operating in the areas of higher education, health and long-term care, arts and humanities, human services, science and the environment, and public affairs. Grants are made toward projects involving construction or renovation of facilities and the purchase of major capital equipment or real estate.

Kresge grants are made on a challenge basis, requiring that recipients raise the remainder of funds needed to complete particular projects. The Kresge Foundation strongly encourages institutions to use the challenge grant as an initiative for securing gifts from new donors and increasing support from current benefactors.

The Kresge Foundation is an independent, private foundation created by the personal gifts of Sebastian S. Kresge. It is not affiliated with any corporation or organization. Through September of this year, the Foundation had awarded 92 grants totalling \$47,286,485.
