METHODIST COLLEGE TO HOLD GROUNDBREAKING FOR COMPUTER SCIENCE & MATHEMATICS BUILDING

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Methodist College will hold a formal groundbreaking ceremony Thursday, October 10 at 9:15 a.m. for its new computer science and mathematics building.

Construction is now under way on the 8,500 square-foot building, which is located on the west side of the Science Building. It will contain four classrooms, two computer labs, and eight offices. Completion is slated for late March 1997.

Player, Inc. of Fayetteville is the general contractor. The building was designed by Shuller, Ferris, Johnson, and Lindstrom. The project is being financed with revenue bonds at a total cost of \$1,140,704, including architect's fees, furnishings and equipment.

METHODIST COLLEGE PLANS 40TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Methodist College will hold a 40th anniversary celebration Wednesday, October 30 at 11 a.m. in Reeves Auditorium. The college was chartered November 1, 1956.

Entitled "Celebrate 40!", the program will include a running narrative about the college's first 40 years, color slides from the college archives, and a variety of musical numbers featuring alumni, staff, and current students. Invitations have been mailed to area alumni, trustees, retired staff and faculty, and friends of the college.

The Methodist College Alumni Association has planned and coordinated the event, along with a committee made up of college staff members. Lynn Carraway '71, president of the alumni association, said the celebration will be "a lighthearted, nostalgic look at the College's first 40 years."

Designed to last about an hour, the program will make extensive use of popular music from the past 40 years. Live performances will feature songs made popular by Elvis Presley, The Supremes, Sonny & Cher, the Bee Gees, Cat Stevens, and Kool and the Gang. Dr. Tony DeLapa, the college's academic dean, has formed a trio of "California raisins" to render "I Heard It Through the Grapevine."

After the show, birthday cake will be served in the Reeves lobby and alumni and other friends will have lunch in the Alumni Dining Room of the Berns Student Center.

In conjunction with the actual celebration, colorful "Celebrate 40!" banners have been ordered and will be installed on campus lamp posts. A full-page ad will also appear in the Fayetteville Observer-Times, inviting alumni and friends in the Fayetteville area to attend the October 30 celebration.

PIANO RECITAL, CONCERT SLATED FOR OCT. 25, 26 AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Methodist College will be the site of two free concerts Oct. 25 and 26, when the North Carolina Music Teachers Association holds its state convention at Methodist.

Pianist Rebecca Penneys, professor of piano at the Eastman School of Music and chair of the Piano Department at the Chataqua Institution, will give a recital Friday, October 25 at 8:15 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium. She is the NCMTA's guest artist for this year's convention.

Born in Los Angeles, Penneys has appeared throughout Europe and the United States as an orchestral soloist and as pianist-founder of the New Arts Trio. She won major piano competitions in Poland, Spain, and Portugal and has made several CD recordings. During the current academic year she will record all of the Brahms Hungarian Dances and finish a book about the piano.

In her recital at Methodist, Penneys will perform Schubert's "Sonate in A Major," George Crumb's "A Little Suite for Christmas," Galuppi's "Sonata in C Major," and two works by Franz Liszt: "Concert Etude: Un Sospiro" and "Mephisto Waltz."

The Saturday, October 26 concert will feature two members of the Methodist College music faculty: Valerie Oyen-Larsen, mezzo-soprano; accompanied by Jane Weeks Gardiner, pianist; as well as the Cumberland Oratorio Singers, under the direction of Alan Porter.

In the first half of the program, Mrs. Larsen will perform "Frauenliebe und-leben," a song cycle by Robert Schumann, as well as four songs from William Bolcom's *I Will Breathe a Mountain*.

A graduate of Austin Peay State University and the University of North Dakota, Mrs. Larsen is a vocalist, pianist and composer with a wide range of musical experience. She teaches voice at Methodist and serves as accompanist for the Cumberland Oratorio Singers.

Mrs. Gardiner is associate professor of music and chair of the Music Department. A Fayetteville native, she holds degrees from the New England Conservatory of Music and Salem College. During the ten years she has taught at Methodist, she has been an active recitalist, accompanist, and adjudicator.

The second half of Saturday's concert will feature the Cumberland Oratorio Singers, under the direction of Alan Porter. The group will perform six varied examples of a capella music from the last four centuries (by Mozart, Schubert, Paul Tschesnokoff, Randall Thompson, and William Dawson), as well as operatic choruses from: *The Bartered Bride* by Smetana, *Dido and Aeneas* by Purcell, *Il Trovatore* by Verdi, and *Don Pasquale* by Donizetti.

Mr. Porter is professor of music and director of the college chorus. Since joining the Methodist faculty in 1963, the Pennsylvania native has been an active recitalist, conductor, clinician, and adjudicator. An honors graduate of the University of Illinois and Mount Union College, he is also director of music at Hay Street United Methodist Church.
