JOE TODD TO CHAIR 1997 FUND DRIVE FOR METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Joseph H. Todd, a retired certified public accountant, will chair the 1997 Community Loyalty Campaign for Methodist College. A kickoff breakfast will be held Tuesday, February 11 at the college.

Once a year, the Methodist College Foundation asks local citizens to help with ongoing support of the college by contributing to the annual fund. Continuing the "Expanding the Vision" theme of last year, the Foundation has set a 1997 goal of \$225,000.

"Methodist College is one of Fayetteville's greatest assets," said Todd, "In fact, it has emerged as one of the leading educational institutions in southeastern North Carolina. I am proud to say that I was in a Boy Scout troop that raised a flag at Methodist's groundbreaking in 1958."

Mr. Todd is a partner in the accounting firm of Todd, Rivenbark, and Puryear. He is a Fayetteville native and a graduate of Duke University. He has been active in professional and civic organizations and currently chairs the board of directors of the CARE Clinic. He is a director of the United Way Youth Growth Stock Trust, a member of the Fayetteville Kiwanis Club, and a member of Highland Presbyterian Church.

"Joe Todd is an enthusiastic and energetic supporter of the college who knows our community well," said John Holmes, president of the Methodist College Foundation. "I am confident he will lead a successful fund drive."

The Methodist College Foundation has raised a total of \$7.8 million in sustaining funds for Methodist since 1957. The Foundation was formed in 1956 to bring a church-related college to Fayetteville.

DR. JAMES EFIRD TO CONDUCT PASTOR'S SCHOOL AT METHODIST COLLEGE

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. James Efird, Professor of Biblical Interpretation at Duke Divinity School, will be the featured speaker at Methodist College's second annual Pastor's Day April 1. Admission is free and the public is invited.

Dr. Efird will give lectures at 10 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. in Hensdale Chapel. His morning topic will be "Paul and Women." The afternoon lecture is entitled, "Will the End-Times Really Begin in 2000?" Persons wishing to attend both lectures may purchase lunch in the college cafeteria.

This year's speaker is an ordained Presbyterian minister who has written 13 books and over 60 articles. He has taught Bible to laity groups of all major denominations and has done interim "supply preaching" at Presbyterian churches in the Durham area. JOHN TEMPLETON TO SPEAK AT 20TH ANNUAL STOCK MARKET SYMPOSIUM

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—John M. Templeton, founder and former chairman of Templeton Mutual Funds, will be the guest speaker at Methodist College's 20th annual Stock Market Symposium Thursday, April 17. This year's event will be held at the Charlie Rose Agri-Expo Center; it begins with a banquet at 6:30 p.m.

Often referred to as "the pioneer of global investing," Mr. Templeton managed the Templeton Growth Fund from 1954-1992 and made billions buying overseas stocks. Born Winchester, Tennessee and educated at Yale and Oxford, Templeton is a man of many "firsts." He was the first person named to *Wall Street Week's* Hall of Fame, the first person selected by *USA Today* as "Mutual Fund Manager of the Year," and the first recipient of the Professional Excellence Award given by the Association of Investment Management and Research. "We are excited to have a man of Mr. Templeton's stature as the keynote speaker for our 20th Stock Market Symposium," said Dr. Elton Hendricks, president of Methodist College. "Dr. Sid Gautam, the director of our Center for Entrepreneurship and the founder of this series, is working hard to ensure that we have a record turnout. Those who attend will receive a commemorative booklet that includes a history of the New York Stock Exchange and highlights from our previous symposia."

Now 84 and retired, John Templeton lives in Nassau, Bahamas. During his Fayetteville appearance he will discuss global investment opportunities for the 90's and beyond. In an interview with *Money* magazine last March, Templeton cited mutual funds invested in Mexico, Portugal, and Eastern Europe as offering the best overseas earnings potential. On the domestic front, he made Fidelity Real Estate Investment Portfolio, one of America's largest real estate investment trusts, his top pick.

John Marks Templeton

John Marks Templeton, often referred to as the pioneer of global investing, made his fortune as founder and manager of the Templeton Growth Fund from 1954 to 1992.

Born November 29, 1912 in Winchester, Tennessee, he won a scholarship to Yale University, where he was president of Phi Beta Kappa. He then obtained his Master of Arts degree in law from Balliol College, Oxford University, where he was a Rhodes Scholar. He entered the financial field in 1937 as secretary-treasurer of the National Geophysics Company of Dallas and New York.

John Templeton is a man of many firsts. He was the first person named to *Wall Street Week's* Hall of Fame. In 1990, he became *USA Today's* first "Mutual Fund Manager of the Year" and received the first award for "Professional Excellence" from the Association of Investment Management and Research. During his tenure, the Templeton Growth Fund produced an average annual return of 14.3 percent.

When he was growing up, Templeton considered becoming a missionary. His interest in spiritual issues has remained strong throughout his business and financial career. In 1972 he established the Templeton Prize for Progress in Religion, an annual prize worth \$1 million, to recognize frontier thinking in religion that contributes to humanity's understanding of God, spirituality, and the universe. In 1978 he established the John Templeton Foundation to explore spiritual and moral progress through the use of scientific methods.

John Templeton has been a leader on many fronts, serving as a volunteer member of corporate, hospital, civic, and academic governing boards. From 1967-73 and from 1979-83, he served as chairman of the board of trustees of Princeton Theological Seminary. From 1941-1973 he was a trustee of Wilson College. He served on the Council of Theological Seminaries for the United Presbyterian Church U.S.A. from 1959-84, was a member of that denomination's Commission on Ecumenical Mission from 1961-70, and is a member of the governing board of the Presbyterian Ministers Fund, Inc.

In 1984, John Templeton made a gift of \$3.9 million pounds to the Oxford University Center for Management Studies in England; the graduate school was then renamed Templeton College and allowed to matriculate 12 students a year. In 1987 Templeton was knighted by Queen Elizabeth for his philanthropic efforts. In 1994, he made a further gift of \$3.2 million pounds toward the Templeton College Endowment. Templeton has been awarded honorary doctoral degrees by Beaver College, Marquette University, Jamestown College, Maryville College, Wilson College, Buena Vista College, and the University of the South.

Retired from investment management since 1992, John Templeton now lives in Nassau, Bahamas, and devotes his full attention to the work of his Foundation. In 1995, his son, Dr. John M. Templeton, Jr., left his practice as a pediatric surgeon to serve full time as president of the John Templeton Foundation, which now funds more than 40 projects, studies, award programs and publications around the world. These programs focus on five areas: spiritual information through science, spirituality and health, free enterprise education, character development, and the Templeton Prize for Progress in Religion. The Templeton Lectures, The Templeton Honor Rolls for Education in a Free Society, the *Laws of Life Essay Contest* (for junior and senior high school students), and The Honor Roll for Character Building Colleges are four examples of how the Foundation seeks to further its objectives and their realization by institutions and individuals.
