COUNCIL ON SOCIAL WORK EDUCATION ACCREDITS METHODIST COLLEGE PROGRAM

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Council on Social Work Education has granted accreditation to the Methodist College social work program.

Dr. Joyce White, program director and professor of social work, received formal notification from the national accrediting body February 21. "This is the culmination of five years' work," said Dr. White. "Accreditation will make our Bachelor of Social Work graduates more marketable and enable many to enter Master of Social Work programs with advanced standing."

Dr. White and Ms. Terri Moore Brown, coordinator of field instruction and associate professor of social work, conducted an extensive self-study to demonstrate compliance with CSWE standards and were visited on four different occasions by CSWE commissioners.

Dr. White led similar CSWE accreditation efforts at Campbell University and Delaware State College; now in her third year at Methodist, she holds M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Ms. Brown is a 1985 graduate of Methodist College who holds a Master of Social Work degree from East Carolina University and is working on a doctorate at N. C. State University.

College President Elton Hendricks described CSWE accreditation as "yet another feather in our cap, a sign that Methodist College is meeting or exceeding national standards in an important field. I commend Dr. White, Ms. Terri Brown, Dr. John Sill, Dr. Anthony DeLapa, and the other faculty and staff members who were involved in this effort. This is the fourth program for which we've received national accreditation since 1992 and we are approaching similar approval for other programs."

Methodist College's Bachelor of Social Work program is the 15th in the state to earn CSWE accreditation. "Our program uses a 'generalist practice model,' said Dr. White, "which assumes that the BSW will be the first person the client sees. We now have 65 majors in the program. Our next step is to move toward school social worker certification and gerontology certification."

PAT JONES, METHODIST COLLEGE MATH PROFESSOR, FEATURED IN BOOK

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Pat Jones, associate professor of mathematics at Methodist College, is featured in *101 Careers in Mathematics*, a book published last year by the Mathematical Association of America.

Edited by Andrew Sterrett, the book includes 101 autobiographical sketches written by mathematics majors employed in a wide variety of fields. The MAA published the book to show high school and college students that, "There are really no limits to what you can do if you are well prepared in mathematics."

Mrs. Jones said her two-page profile in the book was the result of a 1994 telephone interview. "I don't know how or why I was chosen," she said, "but I am honored to have been included. I'm also pleased that Methodist College will receive some exposure from this."

The former head of the Methodist College Mathematics Department, Pat Jones received the College's Professor of the Year Award in 1995. Now in her 15th year at Methodist, she is currently teaching an introductory math course, a math course for prospective elementary school teachers, Pre-Calculus II, and a methods course for middle school and high school teachers. "Modern Geometry" is her favorite subject, followed closely by methods courses for public school math teachers.

Mrs. Jones is a Fayetteville native and a graduate of Seventy-First High School, Meredith College and the University of North Carolina. What made her decide to become a math teacher? "I've always enjoyed the challenge of solving math problems," she said. "Mrs. Leslie Dews, my geometry teacher at Seventy-First High School, encouraged me. Dr. E. F. Cannady at Meredith College was also a good mentor."

Mrs. Jones possesses a wide range of teaching experience, including four years at the high school level. She taught one year at Southern High School in Durham County, one year at Prince Edward Academy in Virginia, and two years at Fayetteville Senior High School. Before her employment at Methodist, Mrs. Jones also taught at East Carolina University, the

University of Southern Mississippi, and the Fort Bragg components of Fayetteville State University and Fayetteville Technical Community College.

Pat Jones has been very active in the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics (NCTM) and its North Carolina affiliate. In 1993 she attended the first U. S.-Russia Joint Conference on Mathematics Education in Moscow, where she presented a paper on the use of graphing calculators in mathematics instruction. She is a strong believer in new technology and the use of games, computer software, and other manipulatives in teaching math.

In her autobiographical essay for the book 101 Careers in Mathematics, Mrs. Jones recounted her 1993 trip to Russia and said that math teachers in both countries face many of the same challenges and goals. She observed that while Russia lacks national standards for mathematics education and many classrooms do not have the latest technology (e.g. calculators), students in the schools she visited did show a good mastery of basic math concepts.

The trip to Russia was not her first abroad. In the summer of 1986, Mrs. Jones studied the history of mathematics and mathematics education in London, at an institute sponsored by South Bank Polytechnic and City College New York.

Looking at her Methodist College teaching situation, she observes, "Students coming to college are weak in the basics and we've had trouble incorporating new technology into our courses. We're debating now whether to require students to use graphing calculators in the required math courses." (These calucators have been used in upper level courses since 1993.)

Although she resigned as department chair two years ago, Pat Jones remains very active in professional organizations and was recently nominated for vice president of the North Carolina Council of Teachers of Math.

CANNON FOUNDATION AWARDS METHODIST COLLEGE \$50,000 GRANT TOWARD LIBRARY ADDITION

FAYETTEVILLE, NC— The Cannon Foundation, Inc., based in Concord, North Carolina, has awarded Methodist College a \$50,000 grant toward the construction of an addition to the Davis Memorial Library.

College President Elton Hendricks was notified of the award in a March 4 letter from Dan Gray, executive director of The Cannon Foundation.

Methodist College is seeking \$1.9 million to build the library addition as part of its \$6.5 million "Expanding the Vision" capital campaign. Last September, The Kresge Foundation awarded Methodist a \$300,000 challenge grant toward the project, contingent upon the college raising \$1,458,500—the amount needed to reach a total capital campaign goal of \$6.5 million—by December 1, 1997. With the Cannon grant, the college has now received \$1,420,700 in gifts and pledges toward the library annex.

"The recognition and support from The Cannon Foundation is very significant for Methodist College, "said President Hendricks. "It puts us one step closer to meeting the Kresge challenge. We received an identical gift from Cannon in 1989 toward construction of the March F. Riddle Physical Activities Center."

The two-story addition to Davis Memorial Library will be built behind the current structure and will add 13,544 square feet of much-needed space for reference works, study carrels,

audiovisual materials, computer work stations, special collections, and staff offices. The library will gain a new entrance, with a new circulation/reference desk, on the first floor of the annex where it connects to the present structure.

Completed in 1964, Davis Memorial Library contains 17,656 square feet of space and houses over 86,000 volumes, including journals and bound periodicals. As shelving has been added to the main floor to accommodate a growing collection, seating and study space has become limited; a total of 270 patrons can now be seated in the library. Methodist College has a current enrollment of 1,600 students.

"Our capital campaign is making tremendous progress," noted Jay Dowd, vice president for institutional advancement. "The Cannon Foundation's grant gives added momentum to our efforts to reach the \$6,550,000 campaign goal. We deeply appreciate this vote of confidence in Methodist College."

The college's current capital campaign has five goals: \$1.9 million for an addition to the library, \$1 million for a new academic building, \$1,650,000 for ongoing support, \$1,000,000 for the endowment, and \$1 million for a math and computer science building. As of March 3, the college has gifts and pledges totalling \$5,790,000, which includes the \$300,000 challenge grant from Kresge.

The math and computer science building is now under construction and is being financed through a bond issue. That project will be finished this summer.
