

METHODIST COLLEGE ENROLLS RECORD NUMBERS

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Methodist College began its 39th academic year with record enrollment in the regular day program, a record number of freshmen, and a record number of residential students.

As of Drop/Add Day Sept. 7, Methodist had enrolled 1,332 students in the regular day program compared to 1,291 in Fall 1997. Enrollment in the Evening College reached 481, up from 410 in Fall 1997. The total unduplicated headcount was 1,724 students. College officials are expecting 75-100 additional evening students for Fall Term II beginning Oct. 19, which would push total enrollment for the fall semester beyond 1,800 students.

Rick Lowe, vice president for enrollment services, reported that the College enrolled 587 new students, seven more than last fall. The new students include: 398 freshmen (41 more than last fall), 163 transfers, 23 re-admits, and three visiting students. The number of returning students was 745, up 34 from last fall.

A record 701 students are living on campus this fall, compared to 645 on Drop/Add Day last year. There are 511 male resident students and 190 females.

Methodist College set another record this summer by enrolling 825 students, 6 percent more than the preceding summer. The total unduplicated headcount for 1997--98 (fall, spring, and summer semesters) was 2,135 students.

OLD TESTAMENT SCHOLAR TO SPEAK AT METHODIST

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. Walter Brueggemann, Professor of Old Testament at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia, will deliver the fifth annual Samuel J. and Norma Womack Endowed Lectures Monday, Oct. 12 at Methodist College.

"Thinking Otherwise" is the theme for this year's lectures, both of which are free and open to the general public. Dr. Brueggemann's 11 a.m. lecture is entitled "Solomon and the Global Economy." His 3 p.m. lecture topic is "Elijah's Wild Card." Both lectures will be held in Hensdale Chapel.

An ordained minister in the United Church of Christ, Dr. Brueggemann holds a Th.D. in Old Testament Studies from Union Theological Seminary and a Ph.D. in Education from St. Louis University. The Nebraska native also holds a number of honorary degrees and is an honorary member of the British Society for Old Testament Study. He has served as a visiting lecturer at Cambridge, Yale, and Vanderbilt universities.

Dr. Brueggemann is the author of several books, the most recent being *Theology of the Old Testament* (Fortress, 1997). He has also written many scholarly articles and has served on the Editorial Council of the *Journal of Biblical Literature, Interpretation*, and *Theology Today*. He currently serves as editor of the Overtures Book Series at Fortress Press, as a contribiting editor of *Sojourners*, and as an associate editor of the *Journal for Preachers*.
