## DAVIS MEMORIAL LIBRARY FEATURES 'CAROLINA ECHOES'

**FAYETTEVILLE, NC**—The Special Collections Room of Davis Memorial Library currently features an exhibit entitled "Carolina Echoes" commemorating Carolina College, a women's college which operated in Maxton, NC from 1912-1926.

Comprised primarily of photographs but also including College memorabilia such as pins and banners, the exhibit materials were prepared by Methodist student Tracie McCarley, under the direction of Dr. Charles Briscoe, adjunct instructor of history. McCarley prepared the exhibit as part of her internship at Fayetteville's Museum of the Cape Fear.

Dr. Briscoe first came across the Carolina College archives in Davis Library two years ago and realized the pictures and other items could prove valuable in the study of North Carolina social history. He and McCarley patiently reconstructed the life of the College in its social setting, including school songs and rituals. One part of the exhibit deals with social life, and the other chronicles sports at Carolina.

Carolina College was founded by the North Carolina Methodists to provide young women from the region educational opportunities not readily available to many women of the era. The school offered a variety of programs, including a bachelor's degree program and teacher training. In 1919, Carolina became a junior college. Due to financial pressures, the school closed permanently in 1926. The site was later used by Carolina Military Academy, a preparatory school which burned in 1973.

"Carolina Echoes" can be viewed during the library's normal operating hours. Part of the exhibit will remain on permanent display in the Special Collections Room.



**FAYETTEVILLE, NC**—Methodist College will celebrate Christmas with a Moravian Love Feast Sunday, Dec. 5 at 7 p.m. in Hensdale Chapel.

The traditional Moravian Love Feast celebrates the birth of Christ through scripture reading and prayer, the singing of hymns, the lighting of candles, and the serving of Moravian bread and coffee. The Love Feast has been an annual tradition at Methodist since 1974, when Rick Wilson, a Methodist College student reared in the Moravian Church in Winston-Salem, NC, organized the first such service.

The first love feast in Wachovia (the region now known as Winston-Salem, NC) was held Nov. 17, 1753, on the evening of the arrival of the first Moravian colonists in North Carolina. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, took part in a Moravian Love Feast in 1837 and introduced it to his fellow Methodists the following year, making provision for it in the ritual of the church.

The Rev. Carl King, campus minister at Methodist College, will be the liturgist for Methodist's Love Feast. He will be assisted by student servers, a guest soloist and a guest organist.

## METHODIST COLLEGE DEBATERS WIN SIX ROUNDS IN TWO OUTINGS

**FAYETTEVILLE, NC**—The Methodist College Debate Team of Susanne Graves and Ron Berry performed well in debate tournaments this fall at Wake Forest University and Liberty University. Graves and Berry competed in the Junior Varsity Division.

In the Wake Forest University Dixie Debate Tournament Nov. 20-22, Graves and Berry defeated teams from Cornell, West Virginia and Louisville, nearly making the semifinal rounds. The pair won three of five rounds. In the Liberty University Debate Tournament Nov. 12-14, the MC team advanced to the partial octo-finals by winning three of six rounds. Next semester they will compete in tournaments at the U. S. Naval Academy and George Mason University.

First-Year Debate Coach Todd Lyden said he felt the MC debaters had gained valuable experience in their last two outings. "I think we learned where we can improve and be even more competitive next semester," said Lyden. "I am proud that we performed well against some nationally-ranked teams. There is no conference system in debate as there is for NCAA sports, so we have to argue against teams from larger schools like Duke, Southern California, Pepperdine, James Madison, and South Carolina."

This year all collegiate debate teams are required to debate both sides of the national topic: "Resolved: That the United States Federal Government should adopt a policy of constructive engagement, including the removal of all or nearly all economic sanctions with the government (s) of one or more of the following nation-states: Cuba, Iran, Iraq, North Korea, Syria." On the affirmative side, Methodist advocates that the U. S. lift sanctions against Syria and give the country monetary assistance.
