METHODIST COLLEGE PHILOSOPHY PROFESSOR TO PRESENT PAPER ADVOCATING CAPITAL PUNISHMENT FOR JUVENILES

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. Richard Hall, assistant professor of philosophy at Methodist College, will present a paper entitled "Should We Execute Children?" Thursday, March 16 at the College's fourth annual B. F. Endowed Lyceum.

Sponsored by the Faculty Collegiality and Development Group and the President's Office, the lyceum will be held in Yarborough Auditorium, Clark Hall, beginning at 7 p.m. Admission is free and the public is invited. A reception will be held afterward in the Mallett-Rogers House.

In his paper, Dr. Hall argues that minors (primarily teenagers under the age of 18) accused of capital murder should be tried and punished as adults. He supports his thesis on philosophical grounds. Following Dr. Hall's presentation, a panel of experts from the fields of criminal justice, pastoral ministry, and religious studies will respond to his paper. The panelists are: Dr. James Welch, pastor of McPherson Presbyterian Church; Dr. Richard Cania, professor of criminal justice at UNC-Pembroke; Dr. Grayson Carter, associate professor of religion at Methodist. Dr. Welch and Dr. Carter will argue against Dr. Hall's thesis, and Dr. Cania will argue in favor of it.

The B. F. Stone Endowed Lyceum honors the late B. F. Stone of Elizabethtown, NC. A pharmacist and an active United Methodist, Mr. Stone made a large bequest to Methodist, portions of which have been used to create a scholarship and to endow this event. Faculty members selected to give papers at the lyceum are expected to focus on interdisciplinary subjects. Presenters receive an honorarium from B. F. Stone funds.



SHAWN HARTMAN RECEIVES WILLIAM P. LOWDERMILK STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



DIRECTOR OF VATICAN OBSERVATORY TO SPEAK AT METHODIST

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. George Coyne, S. J., director of the Vatican Observatory, will deliver the first John Templeton Endowed Lecture in Science and Religion Thursday, April 13 at Methodist College. He will speak at 11 a.m. in Yarborough Auditorium, Clark Hall. The event is free and open to the public.

Dr. Coyne, who will speak on the topic "When the Sacred Cows of Religion and Science Meet," directs the Vatican's Astronomical Observatory in Italy and is a staff member at Kitt Peak Observatory in Arizona. There has been some media speculation that the Vatican built the Arizona observatory to observe a comet that is headed toward Earth.

A Templeton Foundation grant that funds the new lecture series was also used to establish a new religion course at Methodist entitled, "Religion in an Age of Science: Supplemental Spiritual Information." Dr. Lloyd Bailey, a retired religion professor and former faculty member at Duke Divinity School, developed and teaches the course.

A renowned international investment manager, now retired, John Marks Templeton established a foundation to promote spiritual information through science, spirituality and health, free enterprise education, character development, and the Templeton Prize for Progress in Religion.
