### METHODIST COLLEGE ENROLLMENT GROWS 8 PERCENT TO 2,613

**FAYETTEVILLE, NC**—Methodist College enrolled a record 2,613 students during its 40th academic year, 8 percent more than the preceding year.

The unduplicated headcount of 2,613 for 1999-2000 encompasses the fall, spring, and summer semesters (day and evening students combined) and compares to a 1998-99 total of 2,400 students. A total of 1,908 students enrolled in day classes and 705 students enrolled in evening or weekend classes.

Methodist College Registrar Harvey Adams released the following breakdown of unduplicated headcounts for 1999-2000: 1,974 for the fall semester (1,343 day, 630 evening), 1,840 for the spring semester (1,240 day, 597 evening), and 896 for the summer semester (575 day, 321 evening).

As of July 28, a total of 1,375 students were preregistered for the Fall 2000 day program which begins Aug. 22. That is 10 percent more than were preregistered at the same time last year. The College expects another 500-600 students to enroll in evening and weekend classes, which begin the week of Aug. 14.

Completion of Cape Fear Commons, an apartment-style residence hall now in the final stages of construction, will enable Methodist to house a grand total of 798 students on campus. The director of student housing projects that all eight residence halls will be at or near capacity this fall.
