Methodist College Theatre Department Presents 'Just So Stories'

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Methodist College Theatre Department will present four of Rudyard Kipling's *Just So Stories* as its 2001 children's theatre offering. Public performances will be held Friday and Saturday, Nov. 16-17 at 7:30 p.m., and Sunday, Nov. 18 at 2:00 p.m.

A colorful cast of MC students will present adaptations of: "How the Rhinoceros Got his Skin," "How the Camel Got His Hump," "The Sing-Song of Old Man Kangaroo," and everyone's favorite, "The Elephant's Child." The stories are Kipling's humorous take on the kinds of questions all parents get from their inquisitive children. Kipling used his knowledge of the storytelling traditions of Africa, Australia, India, and the Middle East to weave these tales — originally for his daughter, but then, after they were published in 1902, for the whole world.

In "How the Rhinoceros Got his Skin," a rhinoceros with no manners gets his comeuppance from a mysterious Parsee. In "How the Camel Got His Hump," the Camel is punished for his "scrutiatin' idleness" by the Djinn of All the Deserts. "The Sing-Song of Old Man Kangaroo" tells how the Kangaroo got his long legs and his ability to hop. "The Elephant's Child" tells how the Elephant got his trunk, just because he wanted to know what the Crocodile has for dinner.

Tickets for *Just So Stories* are \$7 for adults, \$4 for students and senior citizens, and \$3 for children. For further information, phone the Theatre Department Box Office at 630-7483.

TALLY CENTER FOR LEADERSHIP STUDIES AT METHODIST COLLEGE PRESENTS LECTURE BY DR. THOMAS LEACH

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. Thomas J. Leach, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, will give a lecture entitled “What Heroes Know: Mythic Lessons for the 21st Century” Monday, Nov. 19 at 11 a.m. at Methodist College. The free public lecture will be held in Yarborough Auditorium, Clark Hall.

The speaker will discuss mythic heroes of the past, illustrating how they overcame difficulties remarkably similar to the challenges people face today. He will also discuss some of the leadership principles incorporated in modern leadership training.

Dr. Leach conducts workshop on Myths, Mythology and Modern Culture, Shamanism, and Consciousness Studies. He has taught courses in World Mythology, Literature and Composition at UNC-P since 1979. He holds a Ph.D. in English Literature and an M.A. in English from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and a B.S. in Naval Engineering from the U.S. Naval Academy.

The Nov. 19 lecture will be the first in a new Dialogues in Leadership Series offered by Methodist's Lura S. Tally Center for Leadership Studies. The lecture is made possible by a grant from the North Carolina Humanities Council.

AREA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS WIN ART AWARDS IN JURIED COMPETITION

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Winners in the Methodist College Art Department's first annual Juried Art Competition for Senior High School Students were recognized Sunday, Nov. 11 at the exhibit's opening.

Angela Dennis of West Bladen High School won the First Place Award of \$175 for a tempera work entitled "Disturbed Dream." Miranda Kelly of Western Harnett High School took the Second Place Award of \$100 with an oil painting titled "Self Portrait." Sonja Taimiaho of Jack Britt High School won the Third Place Award of \$75 with a colored-pencil portrait called "Noodles."

Three students received Honorable Mention awards of \$25. They are: Storm Frith of West Bladen High School for a collage entitled "Egypt through the Ages," Ozzie Soto II of Massey Hill Classical High School for a mixed media work called "Self Portrait," and Amanda Inderbitzen of Pine Forest High School for a mixed media work, "Untitled."

From a total of 130 entries, the judges selected 66 art works to be displayed and six works to receive awards. The judges for the competition were Tom Grubb, executive director of the Fayetteville Museum of Art, and Ralph Steeds, professor of art at the University of North Carolina at Pembroke.

All 66 students whose works were selected for the show received certificates of recognition. Their works will remain on public exhibit in the Mallett-Rogers House Gallery at Methodist College Nov. 12-27. The works can be viewed from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily, except for Thanksgiving Day.

The Rev. Benjamin Wells, campus minister at Methodist College, will be the liturgist for Methodist's Love Feast. He will be assisted by student servers, a guest soloist and a guest organist.

The Love Feast is free and open to the public, but due to limited seating, advance tickets are required.
