Methodist College Theatre Department Presents 'Just So Stories'

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—The Methodist College Theatre Department will present four of Rudyard Kipling's *Just So Stories* as its 2001 children's theatre offering. Public performances will be held Friday and Saturday, Nov. 16-17 at 7:30 p.m., and Sunday, Nov. 18 at 2:00 p.m.

A colorful cast of MC students will present adaptations of: "How the Rhinoceros Got his Skin," "How the Camel Got His Hump," "The Sing-Song of Old Man Kangaroo," and everyone's favorite, "The Elephant's Child." The stories are Kipling's humorous take on the kinds of questions all parents get from their inquisitive children. Kipling used his knowledge of the storytelling traditions of Africa, Australia, India, and the Middle East to weave these tales – originally for his daughter, but then, after they were published in 1902, for the whole world.

In "How the Rhinoceros Got his Skin," a rhinoceros with no manners gets his comeuppance from a mysterious Parsee. In "How the Camel Got His Hump," the Camel is punished for his "'scrutiatin' idleness" by the Djinn of All the Deserts. "The Sing-Song of Old Man Kangaroo" tells how the Kangaroo got his long legs and his ability to hop. "The Elephant's Child" tells how the Elephant got his trunk, just because he wanted to know what the Crocodile has for dinner.

TALLY CENTER FOR LEADERSHIP STUDIES AT METHODIST COLLEGE PRESENTS LECTURE BY DR. THOMAS LEACH

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Dr. Thomas J. Leach, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, will give a lecture entitled "What Heroes Know: Mythic Lessons for the 21st Century" Monday, Nov. 19 at 11 a.m. at Methodist College. The Love Feast has been an annual tradition at Methodist since 1974, when Rick Wilson, a Methodist College student reared in the Moravian Church in Winston-Salem, NC, organized the first such service.

The first love feast in Wachovia (the region now known as Winston-Salem, NC) was held Nov. 17, 1753, on the evening of the arrival of the first Moravian colonists in North Carolina. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, took part in a Moravian Love Feast in 1837 and introduced it to his fellow Methodists the following year.

The Rev. Benjamin Wells, campus minister at Methodist College, will be the liturgist for Methodist's Love Feast. He will be assisted by student servers, a guest soloist and a guest organist.

The Love Feast is free and open to the public, but due to limited seating, advance tickets are required.
