New Residence Hall Under Construction

Construction began December 23 on a new \$1.2 million residence hall at Methodist College.

Sigma Construction Co. of Fayetteville, the general contractor, has guaranteed completion by August 10, 1994.

Bulldozers began clearing the site December 23. In late January, the contractor erected a huge tent over the project, which will eliminate bad weather delays.

"This new facility reflects our faith in the future," said Dr. Elton Hendricks, college president. "Our residential enrollment has grown significantly in the last few years and we expect this trend to continue."

Methodist's fifth residence hall is being built on the southeast side of Garber Hall. If enrollment growth continues as expected, an identical unit will be built in 1994-95, just west of the new hall. Both will be linked to Garber by a patio or commons area.

LSV Partnership Architects-Planners of Fayetteville designed the building.

Current plans are that it will house 56 female students and a hall director; the two-story design includes 25 double rooms, six single rooms, and a two-level director's apartment. The hall includes an elevator and other features which make it accessible to the handicapped.

Completion of this facility will enable the college to house approximately 700 resident students in 1994-95. The new residence hall represents the first step in Methodist's long-range plan to expand residential enrollment to 900 students by 1998. Four additional residence halls of similar design will be built during the next four years, subject to annual reviews of enrollment data.

Four existing residence halls built in 1963 and 1964 were designed to house 600 students—300 males and 300 females. Methodist began the current academic year with 610 resident students. Last summer the college renovated a campus apartment building, a 12-unit structure originally designed for married students and faculty, to house an additional 44 students.

Tower Receives Facelift, Lamps, New Carillon

The Yarborough Bell Tower and Jones Memorial Carillon underwent major repairs in December.

First, the 100-foot tower was cleaned and repainted. Then the fluorescent tubes in the cross were replaced. Finally, new speakers and a new sound system (carillon) were installed. Approximately \$13,000 was spent on the restoration.

Since December 15, the electronic carillon has sounded the Westminster chimes/hour strike and played two hymns daily at 5 p.m. Both old timers and those who have never heard the tower are enjoying the beautiful bell sounds.

The new carillon has digitally encoded sounds which represent five different tones/sizes of cast bronze bells. It was manufactured by The Verdin Company in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Methodist's bell tower has not played music since the mid 70's, when the original carillon system was replaced with a chime clock connected to a time-controlled, 100-watt amplifier. The chime clock system became useless in 1990 when the time control ceased to function and when the original speakers and wiring in the tower shorted out.

Foundation Seeks \$225,000 From Community

Early receipts from the Methodist College Foundation's 37th annual Community Loyalty Campaign were encouraging. The theme of this year's drive was "Meeting the Future."

At the end of Loyalty Day, February 8, Fayetteville and Cumberland County residents had contributed \$173,000. That was more than double the \$85,795 received at the same point in 1993 and 77 percent of the foundation's 1994 goal of \$225,000. Staff members in the Development Office—Bev Pankey, Summer Brock, Pat Stump—were elated by the results.

Craig Stewart, vice president and general manager of Stewart Olds/Nissan/Suzuki, is the chairman of the 1994 Community Loyalty Campaign. This year approximately 118 volunteers were asked to call on 671 businesses for donations.

"Thanks largely to local supporters," said Mr. Stewart, "Methodist College continues to be one of the true success stories in higher education. Enrollment is expanding, facilities are being renovated, and the faculty, staff, and students are gaining national recognition. In addition to its 1,700 students, the college played host to more than 40,000 persons last year who came to the campus for cultural events, meetings,

summer camps, and athletic events. With an annual budget and payroll of over \$14 million, it is clear that Methodist has a positive impact on the local economy."

Mrs. Jean Hodges, president of the Methodist College Foundation, expressed confidence that Craig Stewart will lead a "very successful" fund drive

for the college. "Craig has been very active in our community," she said, "and he has strong leadership qualities. He's the best of the best."

Last year's campaign netted \$480,725, more than double the foundation's goal of \$200,000. Local insurance executive Bob Exum chaired the 1993 drive.

W.E. Horner, Trustee Emeritus, Dies At 92

William Edwin "Bill" Horner, a charter member of the Methodist College Board of Trustees, died February 7 in Pinehurst. He was 92.

The former editor-publisher of *The Sanford Herald* served five terms in the N.C. House of Representatives, was a state highway commissioner from 1961-65, and served as a trustee of UNC, Louisburg College, Fayetteville State University, and Methodist College.

Horner Administration Building at Methodist College and Horner Boulevard in Sanford are named for Mr. Horner. He chaired the development committee in the formative years of Methodist College and made many generous gifts to the college over the years.

Mr. Horner was an active civic leader

in Sanford, serving as president of the Kiwanis Club, chairman of the Red Cross, District Chairman of the Boy Scouts, and president of the Sanford Chamber of Commerce. Methodist College awarded him a

Doctor of Humanities degree in 1978. A Durham native, Mr. Horner attended Durham High School and Trinity College (now Duke) and graduated from UNC in 1922. He and his wife moved to Sanford in 1930. Mr. Horner wrote over 2,000 newspaper columns, all signed "WEH". He was a past president of the N.C. Press Association

Mr. Horner is survived by two daughters, Nancy H. Hulin of Wilmington, and Louise H. Bowles of Greensboro; a son, William E. Horner, Jr. of Sanford; a sister, Sue Sample of Statesville; six grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

Bill Horner's funeral was held February 9 at St. Luke United Methodist Church in Sanford. The Revs. Vernon Tyson and Reggie Ponder officiated.

SPRING ENROLLMENT STANDS AT 1,614

Methodist College began the spring semester with 1,614 students, an increase of 4 percent over 1993.

Day enrollment totalled 1,045, up 5 percent from last spring's 987. Spring Term I of Evening College drew 569, seven more than last spring.

The number of students living in the residence halls is 535, compared to 470 in Spring '93.



FORMER CID AGENT DIRECTS CRIMINAL JUSTICE STUDIES

CHAMPION SPARKS INTEREST IN NEW PROGRAM

One of Methodist's newest and most energetic faculty members is Darl H. Champion, assistant professor of criminal justice.

He came to Methodist from Fayetteville Technical Community College, where he directed an associate degree program. After only four semesters—two as an adjunct instructor and two as a full-time faculty member—Champion has attracted 62 students to the criminal justice program. Champion was recruited by Dr. Suzan Cheek, professor of political science, and Dr. Erik Bitterbaum, vice president for academic affairs.

Methodist added a criminal justice major in the fall of 1991, within the Department of Sociology and Social Work. The official term for the major is criminal justice studies; both the bachelor's and associate degrees are offered, as well as a minor.

Why is criminal justice so popular with MC students? "It's a hot topic right now—

a pressing social issue," said Champion. "Many college students are now drawn to careers in law enforcement, juvenile justice, corrections, private security, and human services. Jobs are available in these fields, especially in the law enforcement sector."


Having taught criminal justice in the Fayetteville area for 18 years, Darl Champion is well acquainted with law enforcement personnel and criminal justice issues. Many of his former students now work in area police or sheriff's departments or in state correctional institutions. Some of his former students have transferred from Fayetteville Tech to Methodist in order to earn their bachelor's degrees.

Champion received his bachelor's degree in criminology at Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1970. He then served five years in the U.S. Army, attaining the rank of captain. He commanded the 82nd Airborne Division's Military Police Company and served as a special agent with the Army's Criminal Investigations Command at Fort Bragg.

In 1975, Champion began teaching criminal justice at Fayetteville Tech and started work on his master's at the University of South Carolina. He received his M.S. degree in 1978 and is currently working on his doctorate in adult education at N.C. State University. His dissertation will explore the relationship between critical thinking and police officer performance.

Darl Champion has won three awards for teaching excellence and is highly regarded among criminal justice professionals. He has lectured widely, written book reviews and grant proposals, and served on numerous community college advisory committees. He has been president of the North Carolina Criminal Justice Association. He currently serves on the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission and the governing board of Fayetteville/Cumberland County Crime Stoppers.

Champion said those who believe that building more prisons and hiring more law enforcement personnel will reduce crime in the long term are mistaken. (Gov. Jim Hunt and several state

legislators put such proposals before a special session of the N.C. General Assembly, recently convened to seek solutions to the state's growing crime problem and overcrowded prisons.) "We need to address the root causes of crime," he said. We need permanent solutions, not temporary ones. We need early intervention where families are failing. We need integrated solutions that involve the home, the schools, neighborhoods, and criminal justice agencies. I'm afraid partisanship and political correctness have gotten in the way of common sense."

Methodist's criminal justice program is receiving strong support from the Sandhills region where MC students will intern. Adjunct faculty include: Fayetteville Police Chief Ron Hansen; Juvenile Intake Officer Richard Alligood; Larry Marshall, Special Agent in Charge, USACID, Fort Bragg; Lt. Josh Phillips, Fayetteville Police Department; and Chip Oehme, a former Air Force

intelligence officer now working on his Ph.D. at Cambridge University.

"Over the years, I have developed a close working relationship with the N.C. Justice Academy," said Champion. "This has resulted in the academy utilizing our students in simulations and roleplaying exercises."

Darl Champion clearly enjoys teaching and the challenge of developing a new program. Some of his goals include: establishment of a broad-based advisory board, aggressive pursuit of grants, participation in local research projects, and state certification of Methodist's criminal justice program.

"I will not sacrifice quality for quantity," he added. "I want to establish a high quality program which is integrated with the liberal arts curriculum."

FSU CHANCELLOR URGES STUDENTS TO DEFY RACISM

"We must defy racism and other evils."

That was the message delivered by Dr. Lloyd "Vic" Hackley, chancellor of Fayetteville State University, February 2. Dr. Hackley's address in Hensdale Chapel was the first in a series of five events held in observance of Black History Month.

The Virginia native said true integration—defined in *Webster's Third New World Dictionary* as "a perfect entity" does not yet exist in America's public schools and other institutions. In order to

achieve parity, he said black Americans must change their goals with each generation.

"You gain respect by the content of your character and what you do," said Dr. Hackley. "I was taught to work hard, that character is measured by who you pick up. I was taught that you succeed for the whole community."

Dr. Hackley advised minority students to "keep your health and take care of your children." He said blacks who have achieved great things were loved and encouraged as children. He concluded with these words: "We should think of every child as moving through a tunnel that empties into America. Love the children!"

BOOK OF ESSAYS HONORS PLAYWRIGHT PAUL GREEN

Paul Green's Celebration of Man, with a Bibliography, a collection of essays about North Carolina's Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright, will be published March 6 by Human Technology Interface, Ink.

The book contains 13 lectures given at Methodist College's Southern Writers' Symposium in March, 1987. Mr. Green was the subject of that symposium, which also premiered Lee Yopp's play about Green's life, entitled "Listen To My Song."

Dr. Sue Kimball, professor of English at Methodist College, and Dr. Lynn V. Sadler, former academic dean at Methodist, edited the book. They also spent months compiling a 50-page bibliography of works

about Paul Green. The Paul Green Foundation provided a grant for part of the

Will Growth Continue?

Methodist College has experienced steady enrollment growth—about 5 percent annually—since 1990.

Dr. Elton Hendricks, now in his 11th year as president of the college, believes growth will continue. Last summer, he persuaded the college trustees to adopt a plan for increasing residential enrollment by 50 percent over the next six years.

Alan Coheley, vice president for enrollment services, and his admissions staff are working hard to ensure that we continue to grow. Ditto for other members of the administration, staff, and faculty.

The Methodist coaches, particularly in men's sports, have done a great recruiting job, so much so that men resident students now outnumber women more than 2 to 1. If Methodist College is to have equal numbers of men and women living on campus, as originally intended, then more women must be recruited. Since we have room for additional co-eds, alumni can help greatly by referring women pros-

With additional students, Methodist will be able to upgrade its programs and facilities and attract the gifts and grants needed to meet the demands of the future.

To Keep A Good Thing Growing

The Bottom Line...

Among North Carolina's 33 private four-year colleges, Methodist currently ranks 13th in total cost at \$12,400 per year for a resident student. Tuition is \$8,850. But the bottom line cost to students is

generally much less.

Methodist College believes that no qualified student should be denied entry because of limited finances. Methodist College **this year alone** will award students \$2.9 million in institutional funds in the form of scholarships and/or campus jobs. The \$2.9 million in financial aid that Methodist allots, combined with state, federal, and other sources, makes the college affordable to most students, regardless of family income.

Methodist has just increased its Incentive Scholarship awards for entering freshmen. These scholarships are worth \$2,500- \$7,000 per year, based on a student's SAT scores and class rank in high school. (See accompanying chart.) In addition, Methodist will conduct a Personalized Scholarship Search for

each applicant.

Resident students are eligible for campus jobs worth up to \$1,000 per year. North Carolina residents attending full-time receive Legislative Tuition Grants worth \$1,150.

In 1992-93 Methodist made an average financial aid award of \$8,014 to students with family incomes in the \$18,000-\$23,999 range.* The average grant to those students was \$3,851.

The chart below illustrates the typical bottom line cost of a Methodist College education, after financial aid has been subtracted from the price. Compared to lower-priced institutions, Methodist's expected family contribution of \$4,000 is a bargain.

*According to the U.S. Census of 1990, the median household income in N.C. was \$26,647; in Cumberland County it was \$25,462.

The Greatest Gift...

Since 1976, Methodist College has offered its alumni a special incentive to recruit students for their alma mater. The college has allowed each Methodist graduate to give, at no personal cost, a four-year scholarship to a new student whom he or she recruits.

In 1993-94, a commuting student can receive \$1,000 per year toward tuition, while a resident student can receive up to \$1,500. The exact amount depends on the financial need of each individual; the awards are renewed annually provided the recipient makes satisfactory academic progress.

An alumna/alumnus can award one Greatest Gift Scholarship per academic year, simply by filling out an application form available from the Alumni Office. A total of 278 students are currently receiving Greatest Gift Scholarships; many alumni are helping with recruitmentand we thank you!





FAYETTEVILLE DISTRICT LAY ACADEMY GRADUATES FIRST CLASS

A significant event took place in Hensdale Chapel at Methodist College Tuesday, November 30, 1993. At the conclusion of a service of worship and celebration, the first graduates of the Fayetteville District Lay Academy received certificates of completion from the Center for Continuing Education, Duke Divinity School.

What is this "lay academy" and how did it come to be? Three years ago, the Reverend Helen G. Crotwell, who was superintendent of the Fayetteville District of the United Methodist Church, and Dr. Tryon Lancaster, a faculty member at Methodist College, served together on a committee for the North Carolina Annual Conference. The group's task was to identify ways to help struggling, small membership churches in the conference.

Dr. Steve Long, director of Duke Divinity's Center for Continuing Education, met with the committee to identify problems and explore strategies for strengthening local congregations. One possibility mentioned was the use of qualified and committed laypersons as pastors in small churches.

Dr. Long proposed a two-year academy for the theological training of laypersons. The focus of the program would be to help class members grow in their understanding of the meaning and purpose of the church and how to be effective disciples of Jesus Christ. The curriculum would include biblical studies, Wesleyan theology, the history and practice of worship, the liturgical calendar, and the disciplined life.

The first lay academy in the North Carolina Conference was established in the Fayetteville District. While the concept grew out of a concern for small membership churches, participation was not limited to those congregations.

The academy met for the first time in January, 1991. Members committed to spend ten hours together each quarter, working with the Reverend Carrie W. Parrish, director and instructor.

As the weeks passed, the academy truly became a theological community. Participants shared a hunger for learning, their deep love for and commitment to the spiritual growth of their congregations, and their faith in Jesus Christ. They worshiped and prayed together, sharpened their beliefs, disagreed, struggled, and discovered new insights into the pilgrimage of faith.

Church Leader Makes Strong Case For Cross-Racial Appointments

Recalling the parable of the widow and the unscrupulous judge (Luke 18: 1-8), a United Methodist official recently

urged her fellow members from eastern North Carolina to act justly and decide in favor of a racially inclusive church.

Rev. Barbara Ricks Thompson, general secretary to the General

Commission on Religion and Race of the United Methodist Church, spoke to 275 ministers and lay persons January 15 at Methodist College. The occasion was a Forum on Cross Racial Appointments arranged by the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church,

"It is in the spirit of justice and persistence that a challenge is offered to the people of the church to recognize the sinful and destructive nature of racism," said Rev. Thompson, "to overcome its presence in our midst and to become the truly inclusive community of faith...The

New Testament is replete with instances where Jesus takes a firm stand for justice and equality against racial and religious supremacism...put on a 'judge's wig' and take a seat on the high bench. Hear my petition for justice in the church..."

Although the North Carolina Conference has surveyed the boards of predominantly white churches to determining whether they would accept a black minister, Rev. Thompson said, "Based on the information I have been able to identify for this conference, the cross-racial appointments in place do not include any black clergy."

Rev. Thompson said 1992 data showed that nearly 5 percent of the approximately 853 clergy in the North Carolina Conference were racial and ethnic minority persons. "It is opening the itinerancy fully to these persons that is the issue before us," she said.

The speaker urged the bishop's cabinet in the N.C. Conference to "match the goals and the needs of the congregation with gifts and graces of the clergy—without considering the ethnicity of either."

Methodist's women's basketball team peaked at the right time, going 8-5 in the first month of '94 and finding themselves at the top of the Dixie Conference standings. The women finished the regular season 15-9 overall and 8-4 in the conference.

The Lady Monarchs opened the second half of the season against a very physical and tough University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh team. Sporting an 8-1 record, the Lady Titans were too much for Methodist to handle, handing the Lady Monarchs a 77-38 defeat.

The women enjoyed a four-game winning streak in January, defeating Averett, Shenandoah, N.C. Wesleyan, and Bennett. February brought wins against Meredith, Greensboro College, Ferrum, and Christopher Newport. The four seniors performed well against Christopher Newport in their last regular game, beating the Lady Captains 89-72.

Senior forward Anne Uleman was the leading scorer, averaging 10.2 points per game. She scored her 1,000th career point against Bennett Feb. 16.

EDMUNDS, RHEW KEY MEN'S TEAM

In the wake of a blistering 6-1 start and a No. 15 ranking in the *Columbus Multimedia* National Top 30 poll, the Methodist College men's basketball team cooled off during the second half of the season.

The Monarchs' main problem was inconsistency. Starting the new year, the team failed to win more than two consecutive games and had three two-game losing streaks.

The Monarchs were impressive January 15 against Ferrum. Down 40-36 at the half, Methodist went on an 11minute, 40-13 run and outscored the Panthers 66-29. The Monarchs won the game 102-69.


In a February 13 home game, the Monarchs defeated Shenandoah University 94-91, with a 34-foot jump shot by Gerald Edmunds in the closing seconds.

Monarchs Perform Well at UNC Meet

The Methodist College indoor track team fared quite well in their first meet of the season at the Joe Hilton Invitational Track Meet at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill January

The Monarchs participated in nine events, placing in the top ten in five of them. Methodist was the only Division III and non-scholarship school at the event. Highlights of the day was a record-tying performance by junior Jamelle Ushery (Albany, NY) in the 55 meter hurdles. Ushery turned in a time of 7.82 in the semifinals, to tie the old mark also set by himself in 1993. He finished 11th in the event after running 7.98 in the finals.

Sophomore transfer Hope Kelly (Great Valley, NY) shattered the women's 3,000 and 1,500 meter run with times of 11:13.0 and 5:19.69 respectively. The women's 3,000 meter record was held by Cathi O'Neil (11:16.0, 1990) and the 1,500 by Abigail Findlay (5:30.01, 1993). Kelly, who attended Charleston Southern University last year, finished second in the 3,000 and third in the women's mile.

Women's Golf Team Seeks 4th National Title

Methodist's women's golf team, coached by Ann Davidson, will seek its fourth straight national championship this spring. The Lady Monarchs have won the last three National Golf Coaches Association National Championships.

Methodist will try to uphold the winning tradition that Head Coach Ann Davidson started four years ago. They come into the 1994 campaign ranked Number 1 in preseason national polls. The Lady Monarchs recorded three consecutive National Golf Association National Championships and won seven of the last eight.

Although Methodist loses the 1993 individual national champion in Amy Hoke, the Lady Monarchs won't miss a beat as they return junior Kelly Cap (Boardman, OH), sophomore Anna Rodriguez (Santander, Spain) and junior Elizabeth Horton (Middletown, OH).

Methodist comes into the spring season after a successful fall stint involved some of the top Division I teams in the country. The Lady Monarchs finished tied for tenth with the University of Indiana in the Lady Tar Heel Invitational at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, with a three-day total of 320 and just one



Methodist's men's golf team, which finished third in last year's NCAA Division III National Championships, will try to regain the title held for three consecutive years from 1990-92. Methodist will host the NCAA Division III Championships at King's Grant Country Club in Fayetteville, May 17-20.

The Monarchs return the individual national champion, Ryan Jenkins (Colonial Heights, VA), who turned in a four-day total of 294 at the difficult Torrey Pines (South) Golf Course in LaJolla, CA. Jenkins' win marked the third time Methodist boasted the national champion. Other Monarchs to ascend to the throne are John McCullough (1989) and Rob Pilewski (1990).

The Monarchs face another demanding schedule as they open their season, March 12-13 at the Gordin Collegiate Classic in Surfside Beach, SC. The spring schedule is highlighted by a trip to East Lansing, MI to take part in the Bruce Fossum/Spartan Invitational at Michigan State University, Saturday, May 7.

Baseball Team Returns 8 Starters

The Monarch baseball team returns eight possible starters from last year's squad that went 28-10 (6-6, Dixie, 3rd) and finished the 1993 campaign 14th in the final national rankings.

Missing from the team will be first team All-Conference outfielders Brandon Bridgers and Joe Myrtle. Bridgers left after his junior season when he was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 12th round of the June college draft. Bridgers hit .345 for the Monarchs with 22 runs batted in and two home runs. He led the team in runs scored with 54 and was third in hits with 40.

Myrtle, who also received All-American kudos, hit .360 with 36 runs batted in and was second on the team with four home runs. He was second on he team in runs scored with 36.

Returning for Methodist this season are pitching sensations Matt Boucher (Fayetteville, NC) and Brian Ford (Hope Mills, NC). Boucher led the Monarch pitching staff with a 7-2 record and one save to his credit. He turned in a 2.41 earned run average (E.R.A.) in 74.2 innings pitched. Ford was 8-3 with a 2.95 E.R.A. in 88.1 innings of action. Both Ford and Boucher led the Monarchs in strike outs with 99 and 64 respectively.

Also, returning will be Methodist's leading hitter Matt Berry (Cary, NC). Berry hit .362 with two home runs and was second on the team in runs batted in

Cellist Nancy Green and pianist Frederick Moyer will give a joint concert Friday, March 18 at 8 p.m. in Reeves Auditorium at Methodist College. Admission is free and the public is invited.


